Those Kicking Against Fuel Subsidy Removal Ignorant Of Economic Advantages - Kailani Muhammad

n energy expert and former staff of the Nigeria National Petroleum Corporation (NNPC), Engineer (Dr.) Kailani Muhammad has said that those kicking against the removal of fuel subsidy are either ignorant about the economic advantages or misguided by few selfish individuals.

According to him, the removal of fuel subsidy by President Bola Ahmed Tinubu is the best decision for Nigeria's progress and development.

President Tinubu in his inaugural address on Monday, declared an end to the era of subsidy payment, saying the 2023 budget made no provision for fuel subsidy, so further payment was no longer justifiable.

But this didn't go down well with the labour unions and some Nigerians who felt the decision is hasty.

Engineer Kailani Muhammad, who is also the National Coordinator of Confederation of All Progressives Congress (APC) Support Groups

in a reaction to news on the subsidy removal, said that it was high time NLC, TUC and other Nigerians face the reality of the pronouncement of the President and decision of the national oil company, NNPCL to support it.

While commending President Tinubu for taking the bold step to remove fuel subsidy and Management of NNPCL's position to accept it in good faith, noted that the subsidy era wrecked serious havoc on revenue generation and can't be retained under this harsh economic conditions.

He however, described as unfortunate, the situation where petroleum marketers have within 24 hours of the pronouncement, hiked prices of Premium Motor Spirit (PMS) otherwise known as petrol at the filling stations to over 700 Naira per liter.

He further said, "Marketers hoarding: products should know that NNPCL had said no going back on the withdrawal of subsidy.

"NNPCL is doing its best to ensure adequate supply of fuel to douse the problem of panic buying." He expressed joy that the Mele Kyariled Management has already taken proactive measure to ensure constant fuel supply to avoid queues at filling stations.

Meanwhile, he asked Nigerians to embrace the

decision by President Bola A h m e d Tinubu to reposition the oil industry and create a purse for the proceed accrued from sales of PMS to be used for sustainable development.

"The idea of NLC and other labour unions threatening and demanding that the refineries must be working first before withdrawal of subsidy is retrogressive and far from economic reality," he stressed.

He urged marketers to do the needful by opening stocks and selling to the public with hope that market forces of supply and demand will determine pump prices of petrol henceforth.

According to him, good marketers will capitalise on the advantages and buy and sell at competitive reasonable prices and make more profit on investments.

Eng. Kailani noted that all stakeholders in the oil sector must come together to fashion away out the crisis.

He however, called on Nigerians to support Tinubu-Shettima led APC government with assurance that Nigerians will enjoy sustainable growth and development across all sectors of the economy, adding, "Tinubu has good intentions for the country".



Hajj Reporters Deploys Team To Monitor Pilgrims' Officials, Service Providers In Saudi Arabia

he Independent Haji Reporters (IHR) has set up a 5-man team that will monitor the activities of appointed hajj officials and service providers to Nigerian pilgrims in Saudi Arabia.

A statement signed by IHR National Coordinator, Ibrahim Muhammed, said that the team will work with the Inspectorate and Evaluation Committee of the National Hajj Commission of Nigeria (NAHCON), the IHR National Coordinator Ibrahim Muhammad said in a statement on Thursday.

The not-for-profit civil society organization said the team was set up to ensure that all officials carry out their assigned tasks as spelled out in their schedule of duty.

"The team will also ensure that service providers engaged to serve Nigerian pilgrims in areas of accommodation, transport, feeding, sanitation, tents in Muna and Arafat live up to expectation by providing quality services to Nigerian pilgrims.

"The team will be headed by the IHR National Coordinator Ibrahim Muhammad, to be assisted by the Secretary General Nuruddeen M. Abdallah, Head of Publications Sani Tukur, Jidda Abubakar, and Mustapha Hodi," it said.

The statement said, "over the years, we have observed that some officials, especially adhoc ones, abandon their duties once they get to Saudi Arabia. This ugly trend affects the quality of services that was expected to be offered to our dear pilgrims."

The CSO said, "some officials even go as far as personally demanding to be served instead of serving the pilgrims, which is the primary reason they are appointed."

"Hajj officials from other countries are always in uniform for easy identification and are at the service of their pilgrims 24 hours. Most of them don't perform hajj because they consider their primary responsibility of serving their respective pilgrims weightier than any other secondary issue.

"We are going to obtain the comprehensive lists of all states and NAHCONappointed hajj officials and monitor their performance throughout the hajj," the statement said.

Mr Muhammad said the committee will particularly work with the Inspectorate department in monitoring the officials and service providers in Jeddah, Makkah, Madinah, Muna and Arafat.

"The committee will compile its observations in a form of a report which will be forwarded to all relevant officials for further actions and to serve as a guide towards recruitment of adhoc officials in subsequent hajj exercise," the statement said.

We Back President Tinubu, NNPCL On Fuel Subsidy Removal - CGGED

o a lition for Good Governance and Economic Development (CGGED) has said that as a group of concerned Nigerians fuel subsidy should removed to allow the market forces of demand and supply to determine pump price of petroleum henceforth. This was contained in a statement signed by the National Coordinator,

Coalition for Good Governance and Economic Development, Comrade Usman Abdulkadir, made available to our correspondent.

"Our decision to support the removal of fuel subsidy is because, we discovered from our findings that advantages of removing the fuel subsidy far outweighs the disadvantages business and economic development.

"We have also discovered that failure on side of previous administration to take decisive steps to stop importation of Premium Motor Spirit (PMS) and outright removal of subsidy is highly responsible for recurring scarcity and fuel queues at our filling stations across the country," the group said.

They stated categorically that with dwindling economy and paucity of funds to run government, Nigeria cannot afford to continue to pay 1.2 trillion Naira monthly as fuel subsidy, arguing that opening the market and removal of subsidy will help save money that would be used for sustainable development and quality service delivery.

"It is on this note that we are backing the pronouncement made by President Bola Ahmed Tinubu and the Nigerian National Petroleum Company Limited (NNPCL) on the removal of fuel subsidy.

"It is no longer news that Nigerians woke up watch and listen to shocking pronouncement by the President, in his inaugural address on Monday May 29, 2023, where he openly declared an end to the era of subsidy payment, saying the 2023 budget made no provision for fuel

subsidy, so further payment was no longer justifiable.

"If there is provisions made for fuel subsidy in the budget, how do we expect the current administration to pay for what is not appropriated for? Any attempt to pay for subsidy now, will surely amount to breach law. Moreso, that government can't withdraw money illegally to pay subsidy," they pointed out.

They said that they understand why the management of Engineer Mele Kyari led NNPCL during an emergency press conference held at the NNPC Towers, Abuja, told Nigerians that the move was in the best interest of the company.

"The Chief Executive Officer of the NNPCL revealed that the company has been spending a substantial

> amount of its profits in the subsidy of the product.

> "It is against this background that we insist on removal of subsidy and the money used to pay subsidy in the past be used for development of a gricultural and industrial Sectors.

"We strongly believe that doing so will lead to high production of food and raw materials for industries as well as e m p l o y m e n t generation," they submitted.

FIRS: Nigeria's Tax-To-GDP Ratio, 10.86% As At 2021

igeria's Tax-to-GDP ratio which, in the last 12 years, hovered between 5% to 6% rose to 10.86% by the end of 2021.

The new ratio was communicated to the Federal Inland Revenue Service (FIRS), via a letter signed by the Statistician-General of the Federation, Prince Adeyemi Adeniran, on the 25th of May 2023, following a joint review by the Nigerian Bureau of Statistics (NBS), in collaboration with the Federal Ministry of Finance and the FIRS, using data from 2010 to 2021.

This was contained in a statement signed by the Special Assistant to the Executive Chairman, FIRS (Media Communication), Johannes Oluwatobi Wojuola, dated Wednesday May 31, 2023. The revision took into account revenue items hitherto not previously included in the computations; particularly, relevant revenue collected by other agencies of government.

Tax-to-GDP ratio is a measure of a nation's tax revenue relative to the size of her economy as measured by Gross Domestic Product (GDP). The ratio is a useful tool for assessing the "health" of a country's tax system, and highlighting its tax potentials relative to the size of the economy. It is the ultimate measure of the effectiveness of a nation's tax system compared to other countries.

In a statement announcing the new Tax-to-GDP ratio, the Executive Chairman of FIRS, Mr. Muhammad Nami, explained that sources which previously put the country's Tax-to-GDP ratio at between 5% and 6% did not consider tax revenue accruing to other government agencies in their computation. Particularly, revenues collected by agencies other than the FIRS, Customs and States Internal Revenue Service were excluded. This situation was peculiar to Nigeria as most other countries operate harmonised tax system (all or most tax revenues are collected by one agency of government) with single-point tax revenue reporting. As such, all relevant tax revenues are included in the computation of the Tax-to-GDP ratio.

"In order to correctly state the Tax-to-GDP ratio, the FIRS initiated a review and re-computation of the ratio for 2010 to 2021. In recomputing the ratio, key indicators that were previously left out were taken into account. This resulted into a revised Tax-to-GDP ratio of 10.86% for 2021 as against 6% hitherto reported," the statement noted.

Mr. Nami further noted that Nigeria's Tax-to-GDP ratio should ordinarily be higher than 10.86% but for certain economic and fiscal policy factors, including tax waivers and leakages occasioned by the country's fragmented tax system.

"It is important to note that the Tax-to-GDP ratio for Nigeria should be higher, but for the impact of tax waivers contained in our various tax laws (including exemptions to Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises brought-in by Finance Act, 2019), low tax morale, leakages occasioned by the country's fragmented tax system and the impact of the rebasing of the GDP in 2014", he explained.

The FIRS boss implored the government to consider reviewing its policies on tax waivers thereby guarantying increased revenue to prosecute its programmes and positively move the needle of the country's tax-to-GDP ratio.

The Statistician-General of the Federation, Prince Adeyemi Adeniran, in his letter to the Executive Chairman of FIRS, described the revision as a facelift to the Tax-to-GDP ratio for Nigeria in comparison with other countries.

He further noted that the NBS had "carefully and diligently reviewed the methodology used for computing the revised estimates, as well as the various items that have been included in the new computation," and that the NBS as an outcome of its review and meetings with FIRS has adopted the new Tax-to-GDP computation.

Be Ruthless In Dealing With Corruption, Group Tells Tinubu

*Dares Matawalle to provide evidence of corruption against EFCC boss or face law suit

f President Bola Ahmed Tinubu is to succeed, he must take a decisive step in dealing ruthlessly with corruption irrespective of religious, tribe or political affiliation.

A group, The Corruption Trackers' Initiative gave the advise at a press briefing in Kaduna on Wednesday May 31, 2023.

"We are calling on the president, His Excellency Bola Ahmed Tinubu to be so decisive and ruthless on the issue of corruption if he wants to succeed, the president must not allow anybody irrespective of political affiliation, tribe or religion escape punishment if found culpable in any corruption case," the group said.

"Nobody should be above the law, but blackmail and propaganda should not be tolerated. the corruption trackers' have commenced the mobilization of at least one hundred thousand (100,000) state volunteers to gear up for the new task of NO ESCAPE ROUTE FOR LOOTERS.

"They are expected to monitor and report activities of suspected corrupt public officials and prepare public protest where necessary," they revealed.

According to the text of the press conference titled, "No Escape Route For Looters" they insisted that corrupt public office holders must account for their stewardship after May 29.

"This press conference is to inform the public on our activities, finding and positions on various ministries, departments, agencies, and parastatals in Nigeria based on available man power, resources and expertise.

"It has been a very difficult task but we are happy that our activities will seriously assist constituted authority in bringing public fund looters to book," the group assured.

They said so far, they were able to track over 17 government agencies

and parastatals in the area of corruption, accountability, value for money, prudency and transparency.

"Some of this organisations were able to prove a good record of accountability, transparency and good governance, while some stink in corruption and bad leadership.

"Our findings some agencies, ministries and parastatals engage in last minute recruitments, procurement, contract awarding, auctioning etc.

"Some of them never follow due process and most of the activities are enmeshed in large scale corruption, secrecy and lack decorum for good governance. some politically expose person are already in high level arrangement to leave the country so as to escape been investigated and possible prosecution," the group said.

They averred that some corrupt public officials are already forming groups which they intend to use in blackmailing some of the constituted authorities like EFCC, ICPC etc. to forestall any investigation about their stewardship.

"We shall be submitting our findings and report to constituted authority for further investigation and possible prosecution," they assured.

AYRION Drags Dana Air To Court Over Missing Flight *Demands N50m damages

he All Youths Re-Oriented Initiative Of Nigeria (AYRION) has instituted a legal action against Dana Air over the failure of the airline company to airlift members of the group from Abuja to Lagos on April 28th, 2023 during which the President of the group and others missed "very important business appointment".

Ambassador Ajadi maintained in the writ " Take Notice that in default of your so doing, the claimant may proceed therein, and judgment may be given in your absence".

from Court, "A Declaration that the defendant breached the rights of all the passengers of the defendant including members of the Claimant that boarded her aircraft No. 9J 356 scheduled for nine (9:00pm) from Abuja to Lagos by not airlifting them as scheduled and delaying them to the extent that they without option passed a night and slept in a harsh and uncomfortable manner at the Nnamdi Azikiwe Airport boarding/waiting room without making any provision as to Hotel, water, food, soap and necessary toiletries.

"An Order that the delay in the flight and the non-provisions or making of any arrangement as to a place to sleep, what to sleep on

and other necessaries like water, food, soap and toiletries amounts to negligence and gross misconduct on the part of the Defendant.

"An Order of this Honourable Court recommending necessary disciplinary action to be taking against the respondent to serve as a deterrence to other airline operators by the Nigeria Civil Aviation Authority

An Order of this Honourable Court for general and exemplary damages against the defendant.

"That I know as a fact that this Honourable Court can recommend necessary disciplinary action to be taking against the respondent by the Nigeria Civil Aviation Authority and other regulating authorities to serve as a deterrence to other airline operators".

New Nigerian recalled that Ajadi accused the Dana Air of failure to provide an aircraft to airlift him and other passengers from Abuja to Lagos, despite receiving payments for the service and reassuring passengers, adding that, "this act of negligence from Dana Air prevented him from attending business meeting in Abeokuta on the said night, which not only cost him a financial loss but also dented his integrity, "as someone who cannot keep his promise".



Delta Police Neutralises 2 Suspected Kidnappers, **Rescues Victim, Recovers Firearms, Others**

he winning streak of Police in Delta L State is swelling daily with the killing of two suspected kidnappers by police operatives in a fierce gun duel.

One AK 47 rifle, a pump action gun, 46 rounds of 7.62mm live ammunition and 13 rounds of live cartridges were reportedly recovered from the bandits.

Two victims earlier kidnapped by the gang and their car were also rescued and recovered by the operatives.

Our correspondent reliably gathered that the gang was engaged in a shoot out by operatives attached to Aladja Division, led by its DPO CSP Aliyu Shaba on 31th May 2023 along DSC/ Effurrun road, shortly after they kidnapped the couple.

The police public relations officer DSP Bright Edafe who made the disclosure in a release on Wednesday, said members of the gang on sighting the police, opened fire on the team in a bid to escape.

It reads, "Consequently, on 31/5/2023, at about 0120hrs, CSP Aliyu Shaba led operatives from Ovwian Aladja division and embarked on a confidence building proactive patrol along DSC/Effurrun road.

"During the patrol, the DPO received a distress call that a man and his wife (name withheld) were kidnapped and their lexus Jeep (registration number withheld) was taken also.

"The DPO swiftly trailed the escape route of the suspected kidnappers and eventually intercepted the vehicle along Warri-Sapele road by Aziza junction. "On sighting the police, the suspects opened fire on the team in a bid to escape, and the police professionally

responded, neutralizing two of the suspects in the process, while the other suspects abandoned the kidnapped couples in the vehicle and escaped. The victims were rescued unhurt.

"One AK47 rifle with breach number 16869, forty-six rounds of 7.62 live ammunition, one



pump action gun, and thirteen live cartridges were recovered. Manhunt for the fleeing suspects is ongoing.

"The Commissioner of police, CP Wale Abass, while expressing satisfaction with the conduct of the successful operation, admonished other DPO's to sanitize their areas as well. He

noted that the command under his watch will force criminals to relocate or steer clear from crime.

"The CP also advised parents and community leaders to talk to their youths/wards not to take up arms in order to make a living because they will eventually meet a disastrous end".

Port Standing Task Team Educates Media Practitioners On Its Core Duties, Powers

he Port Standing Task Team has let journalists into its core duties and powers, saying it has the power to arrest, prosecute and sanction agencies, private operators and individuals who fail to comply with the laid down rules and guidelines in the nation's ports.

The National Coordinator of the Team Mr. Moses Fadipe made the disclosurea at the 2-Day Training Retreat organised by the Association of Maritime Journalists of Nigeria, AMJON at the Administrative Staff College of Nigeria (ASCON) in Topo, Badagry in Lagos, the med, "Enhancing Capacity/Efficiency in Modern News Reportage".

Presenting a paper titled, "Port Standing Task Team's Relationship with Government Agencies in Tackling Corruption at the Ports", Fadipe pointed out that the role of the Team is to improve transparency, enhance revenue generation, and tackle corruption, in order to encourage local businesses and foreign investments.

He pointed out that its role is to improve transparency, enhance revenue generation, and tackle corruption, in order to encourage local businesses and foreign investments.

His words: "The PSTT is responsible for the enforcement of the provisions of the Nigerian Port Process Manual (NPPM) which includes the implementation of the Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) for all port-related activities.

"The PSTT ensures that all government agencies and private sector operators comply with the NPPM, thereby improving the ease of doing business at the ports. The PSTT also carries out necessary anti-corruption

measures to dismantle traffic logjams fueling corruption within the port logistics rings at port Western and Eastern ports of the country.

On revenue generation, he stated categorically that revenue generation is not a primary objective of the PSTT and so the team cannot be said to be directly involved in revenue generation.

" HHowever, the NPPM which the PSTT enforces seek to establish a business environment in the country that would lead to improved revenue generation at the ports.

"This is done by ways of plugging leakages to ensure all revenues generated from port operations are remitted to the appropriate government coffers. The PSTT's efforts are also aimed at encouraging foreign investors and local businesses to do business in Nigeria, as they are assured of a transparent and efficient port system".

The National Coordinator PSTT also highlighted that the objectives of the PSTT are already manifesting, adding that many industry stakeholders have attested to the reduction in the cost of doing business at the port as the team role and effort has helped to reduce delays and inefficiencies in the ports.

Others are the reduction of vessels turnaround time in the ports by streamlining processes and eliminating bottlenecks; reduced cargo dwell time; improved movement of haulage; reduction in unreceipted charges, and reduction in incidents of infractions.

"In the area of vessel clearance, the level of incidence of infractions where ship captains feel unfairly treated has reduced tremendously. This has been attributed to the PSTT's efforts in enforcing adherence to the provisions of the NPPM and



carrying out necessary anticorruption measures.

Recalling past event and how PSTT has brought a change, Fadipe said,"In 2019, there were 266 incident reports with an average demurrage of \$20,000 per day. The PSTT was able to prevent unnecessary delays due to quick case resolutions. Case resolutions were down from 7-10 days in the past to 1-8 hours. This trajectory has continued to this day and the amount saved in daily demurrages could be estimated in billions of naira in addition to savings in other operational costs".

On the difference between PSTT and other Task Forces in the ports, he stated that the PSTT is made up of various government agencies and private sector operators, while others are usually established by a single government agency.

He explained further that the PSTT is solely responsible for the enforcement of the NPPM

and has a broader mandate.

"The PSTT operates on a more collaborative basis, with all members working together to achieve its goals in three broad phases. "Phase One: Monitoring of Joint Boarding Exercises and Rummaging.

"Phase Two: Monitoring of Joint Cargo Examination to ensure that goods are cleared in a timely and efficient manner. Phase Three: Dismantling of Illegal Checkpoints and Extortion Points at the Port Logistics Ring tagged "Operation Free the Port Corridor", he said.

The PSTT boss revealed that members are exposed to risks and dangers such as physical attacks, verbal abuse, and threats to their lives and families, as well as bribes while carrying out their duties.

To mitigate the risks, he said that the PSTT has put in place measures to protect its members by providing them with security personnel and protective gear, as well as ensuring that they are adequately trained.

According to him, the management of the team also works consciously with limited resources to ensure that members are incentivised with tokens of allowances and other benefits.

Fadipe tasked AMJON members on accurate and objective reportage on the PSTT's operations to ensure that the public is well informed about the efforts of the team in tackling corruption at the ports.

While suggesting a collaboration between AMJON and the PSTT, he noted that the team will henceforth, update the association regularly on its activities, initiatives, challenges or successes to bridge the information gap.

"AMJON members are expected to adhere to ethical journalism standards and avoid sensationalism or biased reporting. Clear and informed reportage by AMJON members can contribute to building public trust in the PSTT and its efforts to improve transparency and efficiency in port operations.

"AMJON members can also provide feedback and suggestions on how the PSTT can improve its operations. This collaboration can lead to better-informed reportage by AMJON members and a stronger public understanding of the PSTT's efforts to tackle corruption at the ports", he added.

The PSTT was established in 2021 to monitor and enforce compliance with the provisions of the NPPM. It is made up of various government agencies, including the Nigerian Shippers Council (NSC), the Independent Corrupt Practices and Other Related Offences Commission (ICPC), the Department of State Services (DSS), and the Nigerian Ports Authority (NPA).

LASTMA Recovers Trapped Cart Pusher Under Fallen Container

Tragedy has occurred in Lagos as a container conveyed by a truck fell on a cart pusher, killing him instantly.

he fallen container was said to have been fully loaded with concrete stones when it fell on a cart pusher.

However, operatives of the Lagos State Traffic Management Authority (LASTMA) have recovered the corpse of the deceased.

The Director, Public Affairs and Enlightenment Department of the Agency Aebayo Taofiq, who made the disclosure in a release said the incident occurred at Goye by UBA inward Dopemu area of Lagos.

It reads, "Lastma Badmus Abdul-Akeem 'Zebra' (zone 32 Dopemu Akowonjo) who led the rescue team disclosed that the fallen container truck fully loaded with concrete stones fell on a cart pusher who died instantly.

" Lastma Abdul-Akeem disclosed further that prilimnary investigation revealed that the driver of the container lost full concentration while dragging road on top speed with another trailer before fallen off the road blocking the entire brt corridor inward Dopemu.

"He confirmed that while the driver of the fallen truck ran away, Lastma Officials retrieved a photocopy of his driver's license at the accident scene.

"According to Zebra Abdul-Akeem

"After noticing a trapped body underneath a fallen container, we called the LASEMA Response Unit (LRU) and Police men from Gowon Divisional Police Headquarters for immediate rescue operations and investigations.

" While LASEMA Response Unit (LRU) evacuated the fallen container off

the brt corridor, the recovered dead was handed over to members of the Hausa community around Dopemu area after they mobilized themselves to scene of the accident to with dangerous weapons.

"The General Manager of LASTMA Mr Bolaji Oreagba while consoling with the family of deceased urged truck drivers and other motoring public to always adhere strictly to safety standard while driving on highways across the State.

" He however maintained that speed limit road signs were erected to guide truck drivers and other motoring public on speed limitations across the State".

Lagos Gov Performs Ground Breaking Ceremony Of State's Infectious Disease Research Institute

Lagos State Governor, Mr. Babajide Sanwo-Olu on Friday, performed the ground breaking ceremony of the State's Infectious Disease Research Institute (IDRI).

he four-floor IDRI is located within the premises of the Mainland Hospital, Yaba.

The institute is being established to advance knowledge, research and evidence-based information on the identification, prevention, control and effective management of communicable and infectious diseases.

It will accommodate five major facilities including Research Laboratories, Genomics and Reference, Clinics; Teaching rooms, Administrative Offices and Conference Rooms.

Speaking at the event, Governor Sanwo-Olu explained that the proposed establishment and construction of the institute became necessary with the outbreak of Ebola within the Africa sub-region and the emergence of the COVID-19 pandemic which ravaged the world.

He said: "It gives me great pleasure to be here to break the ground for commencement of the construction of the Lagos State Infectious Disease Research Institute (IDRI) at Mainland Hospital, Yaba which will further consolidates our administration's effort to the provision and development of healthcare infrastructure in the state.

"The construction of the proposed Infectious Disease

Research Institute became necessary in the year 2014 with the outbreak of the Ebola virus within this African sub region. The emergence of the global COVID-19 pandemic brought about the turnaround to actualize the dream of the institute".

Sanwo-Olu who was represented by the Commissioner for Transportation, Dr. Frederick Oladeinde noted that the development of the institute, which he termed a critical medical infrastructure, will go a long way in ensuring rapid response and diagnosis to emerging pathogens, especially at the beginning of an outbreak when quarantine, treatment, and other public health measures are most effective.

Underscoring the importance of research to prevention, control and effective management of disease outbreak, the Governor explained that academic research globally has impacted tremendously the provision of scientific and evidence based information and advice on the identification, control and outbreak management of communicable diseases in the 21st Century.

"The role being played by academic research in the improvement of healthcare delivery has necessitated the need for the state to integrate research centers and institutes into the Lagos State Health Master plan. It is hoped that this would facilitate continued learning, and promote national and international medical collaboration", He said.

Sanwo-Olu while noting that Lagos State has a research agenda, explained that his administration has been doing a lot with regards to research on infectious diseases particularly outbreak response and intervention in dealing with pathogens of high consequence, biosecurity threats and pandemic. He noted that the IDRI will facilitate continued learning and promote national and international medical collaboration adding that

"It is popular knowledge that intervention driven by research should happen before the outbreak of infectious disease and not during an outbreak so as to have a clear research understanding and purposeful response and intervention strategies against any outbreak", the Governor said.

He said his administration will not rest on its oars and will continue to work tirelessly in ensuring that Lagos becomes a world class research center and a model of access to quality, efficient, equitable and sustainable health service in the world.

"This Institute will provide a platform for experts to review evidence-based information and advice on the identification, prevention, control and outbreak management of communicable diseases as well as providing feedback for addressing emerging issues of concern", he said.

Speaking in the same vein, the Permanent Secretary, Lagos State Ministry of Health, Dr. Olusegun Ogboye explained that the establishment IDRI is targeted at building the infectious disease research capacity within the state in preparation for health emergencies that may occur in future by providing evidence based information on the identification and control of pathogens of high consequence. Dr Ogboye explained further that the proposed facility; a four floors building sitting on a total of 5,600sqm land space with each floor area being 1,400sqm in measurement, would have an array of services offered on its campus to facilitate learning and innovations.

He noted that the concept designs of the edifice will incorporate eco-friendly designs, with a heavy focus on biosecurity principles that will enable Lagos State to be fully equipped and increase its resilience at all levels to diminish the impact of future diseases that may emerge.

"What we are trying to do now is to stay ahead of the curve by developing this infection disease research institute so that we can be ready for the next agent that may come at any time. We are going to be building capacity of our laboratory workers and our medical practitioners in state so that whenever another epidemic comes we will be ready", He said Also speaking, the Medical Director, Mainland Hospital Yaba, Dr. Abimbola Bowale noted that the bedrock of any health system is research and innovation, adding that the IDRI which is solely dedicated to research will help the Lagos State health system prepare for outbreaks epidemics in the future.

"We have trained manpower and

infrastructure, and then, what we have done today is part of ensuring that we have robust infrastructure to be able to respond to outbreak" he said.

In her remarks, the General Manager, Lagos State Infrastructure Asset Management Agency (LASIAMA), Ms Adenike Adekanbi explained that LASIAMA has been at the forefront of medical and infectious disease infrastructure management since the beginning of the present administration.

She said the involvement of LASIAMA in the IDRI project is in continuation of the function of her agency to manage the State infrastructure assets, stressing that she and her team are excited to be part of the IDRI project.

Fleeing Terrorists Encircle Brinin-Gwari, Allegedly Abduct Many

The Birnin-Gwari Local Government Council chairman, Abdullahi Ibrahim Muhammad Amir, has since issued a warning to the residents of the area to restrict movement in the entire Birnin-Gwari Emirate.

In a widely publicised message, the council chairman warned that after a meeting with the Emirate Council and security agencies in the area, all movements whether on foot; bike or any kind of vehicle is not allowed from 8.30pm in the emirate.

Alhaji Zubair Abdurra'uf, the Danmasanin Birnin-Gwari and former Managing Director of the Kaduna State Media Corporation, told newsmen on Friday night, "when I said early this month that terrorists were closing in on Birnin-Gwari, many people did not believe me."

He explained that now the terrorists have the audacity to enter the main town of Birnin-Gwari and carry out their evil act, saying that he believes the government has been paying lip service to the issue of security in Birnin-Gwari.

He said that if the government is serious about insecurity, the government should come and have a kind of security summit in Birnin-Gwari, discuss issues and strategies, not for public consumption but to bring solutions to the security challenges in the area.

He lamented that at the moment, nobody can go to farm in Birnin-Gwari, particularly the central part, saying that nobody has gone to either clear the farm or even to attempt to do the early planting because the terrorists have taken over most of the farmlands.

Zubair expressed hope that government would do something in these last few days, that would enable the people of Birnin-Gwari to conduct their activities peacefully.

He noted that the local government council has taken drastic measures in imposing a kind of curfew on Birnin-Gwari, hoping that the government would do everything possible to overcome the bad situation between now and Monday, when the incumbent administration would be handing over.

el-Rufai The Visionary: Tribute To An Epitome Of Courage And Character

he annals of Kaduna bear witness to its profound g r e a t n e s s a n d unparalleled influence in the political and economic history of Northern Nigeria and the nation as a whole. However, as we cast our gaze back in recent history up to the year 2014, just prior to Malam el-Rufai assuming office, uncertainty loomed large, and the future of the state appeared devoid of inspiration. This was the Kaduna that el-Rufai inherited.

Yet, unlike many of us who wavered in doubt, el-Rufai arrived with the mindset of a visionary, one who possesses an astute appreciation for Kaduna's rich historical tapestry and a vivid depiction of a future he meticulously painted into a clear vision.

The state found itself in the throes of crisis — a situation that may be likened to that which Winston Churchill described as when "the balance quivers, and the proportions are veiled in mist" — necessitating a departure from the stagnant waters of gradualism and managerial governance. It called for leadership of a transformative nature, steeped in vision and revolution. And in timely fashion, Malam el-Rufai answered the clarion call, assuming the role of Kaduna's modern-day builder.

Malam el-Rufai stands apart, distinguished by his unwavering loyalty to his values. 

Subsidy Is Gone: A Simple Explainer

he enactment of the Petroleum Industry - Act 2021 was intended to mark a significant shift in the regulation of the downstream petroleum sector. The act aimed to align petrol prices with market dynamics, phasing out the fuel subsidy regime. However, despite the planned full deregulation in February 2022, the government continued to allocate funds for subsidies, leading to financial strain and mounting debts.

Under the Petroleum Industry Act, the government ought to have terminated fuel subsidies and allow petrol prices to reflect the general market rates six months after its enactment. However, the government continued to provide for subsidy costs in its budget. Due to financial constraints, the government could not back the subsidy provisions in the 2022 and 2023 budgets with financing, resulting in unpaid subsidy costs. The Nigerian National Petroleum Company Limited (NNPCL) acting as the supplier of last resort offset these costs. This resulted in the accumulation of a debt of N2.8 trillion for the government in the process.

The new President, Bola Ahmed Tinubu has pronounced the termination of the subsidy regime. This is in line with the law and is further necessitated by the inability to finance subsidy commitments since February 2022. The removal of subsidies means that petrol prices will now fluctuate based on market dynamics rather than being fixed.

While the arguments continue on whether the announcement approach was systematic or not, it has to a certain extent saved the country the intense speculative buying activities that would have resulted from scheduling the announcement and other implications that would have marred such gradualism. I consider it a welcome development and commend the President for such uncommon courage which has been missing in the governance space for long.

However, the repercussions extend beyond price adjustments. The rise in price will naturally raise costs of transportation which will in turn further pressurize the country's inflation rate. The government's lack of resources to offset subsidy liabilities since February and the outstanding debt to NNPCL means there hardly will be any room for reinvestment including allocating funds for palliatives or post-subsidy shock alleviation. Moreover, it is crucial to note that even when the government was able to offset the subsidy costs, it relied on borrowing rather than revenue to cover the costs, exacerbating the financial burden.

With the subsidy officially and finally gone, the government must prioritize strategies to repay NNPCL's debt of N2.8 trillion and other subsidy related debts while refocusing on the productive sectors of the economy and social welfare. This commitment demands immediate attention, as the accumulated debt poses a significant liability and might impede effective utilization of government revenues.

An encouraging prospect arises from the current situation as we grapple with outstanding subsidy debts. Once the government's financial circumstances improve, its focus will permanently shift away from the subsidy regime and towards prioritizing crucial areas such as education, health, infrastructure, and other significant sectors. This shift is anticipated and underscores the government's intention to allocate resources towards enhancing public value and renewing national

Meanwhile, the government should advisably prioritize the

Ringim enhancement of public transport systems and collaborate with state governments to improve mass transit systems and infrastructure especially by incorporating more dieselbased buses to the stock of public transport vehicles in their various states. The situation should also serve as an incentive for state governments to renew focus on developing Bus and Light

Rail Transit systems.

To consolidate this hard decision, the government should consider the privatization of state-owned refineries to enhance efficiency and promote private sector participation in the downstream sector. By opening up the refineries to private investment, the government can improve their operational performance,

output and overall local refining capacity. As Dangote refinery gets ready to begin operations, the government should also support other private oil-refining projects like the BUA refinery in Akwa Ibom.

Additionally, the Nigerian National Petroleum Company Limited (NNPCL) should explore the possibility of an initial public offering (IPO) to raise capital and expand its operations. Emphasizing the development of the gas sector could also be beneficial, considering its potential for revenue generation and reducing dependency on imported fuels.

The Road To Heaven May No Longer Be Narrow

s a child I was taught that the road to heaven is narrow. But that seems to be the teachings of the ancients; now across the world, shepherds are letting their flocks know that there are shortcuts, or even flights to heaven. Perhaps the old depended on stars to guide them on the road to heaven while the modern are using Google maps and satellite imaging.

The old idea that the road to heaven is narrow might have been reinforced by Matthew who advised: Enter through the narrow gate. For wide is the gate and broad is the road that leads to destruction, and many enter through it. But small is the gate and narrow the road that leads to life, and only a few find it (Matthew 7: 13-14). I know it immediately warned us to beware of false prophets, but who am I to judge?

The struggle to get to heaven has been quite intense so much that the old church in Rome used to sell pardons (Remission of sin) to the rich who want the Heavens to forgive and guarantee them a place. But these days, there are several ways to get directly to heaven. Some men of the world reasoned that when Adam and Eve were nude, they communed directly with the Lord. So they came to the conclusion that in this ostentatious world when fashion seems to rule worship centres, and bishops deck in heavy regalia, the best route to heaven is to worship in all nakedness. So nudity rules in their churches. In the White Tail Chapel, Ivor, Southampton, Virginia, everybody, including the pastor reading the passages, worship completely nude; just the way they were born. Everyone coming to worship in the church must leave all their material possessions, including clothing, behind and worship only in truth and spirit. Wearing apparels in the church was optional until Sunday, August, 2015, when Pastor Allen Parker announced a complete ban.

He explained this mode of worship: "When Jesus was born he was naked, when he was crucified he was naked and when he arose he left his clothes in the tomb and he was naked. If God made us that way, how can that be wrong? I consider this a gift and a privilege God has given me as our members are caring, understanding and they're community and family oriented. We have one of the most involved chapels any place around."

When a couple, Katie and Robert, tied the nuptial knots, they did so in complete nudity. So, there was no need for wedding gowns or dresses. That must have significantly reduced costs. Worshipping nude to get closer to the Lord on the way to heaven does not mean they will get to the promised land. But never mind, there are churches and shepherds who now, not only guarantee people going to heaven, but doing so without going by road which may still be narrow. So they sell flight tickets to heaven.

In Zimbabwe, Pastor Tito Watts and wife, Amanda who have been selling flight tickets to heaven for \$500 per person are not without customers. What is more: the ticket is inclusive of visa and a straight passage into heaven as it also grants immunity from prosecutions for sins committed on earth. When the police arrested



him, Pastor Watts explained that they had the wrong person as he was merely a salesman for Jesus. His followers believe him and stormed the police station demanding that their pastor be freed to continue his evangelical work.

While there are still debates whether the road to heaven is still narrow or has been widened, a shepherd, Pastor David F. Isanga of the Universal Apostle Fellowship Church of Righteousness, Kaliro, Eastern Uganda, assures his flock that they are already citizens of heaven. The pastor asked them to buy plots of land in heaven. He told his followers to sell all their properties, including houses, farms, livestock and lands, give him the money so he can allocate lands to them in heaven. He did not tell them the size of the lands, whether they are serviced plots and if they are upscale property. He also has not revealed how he became an estate agent in heaven and whether he receives commission.

In all the talk about heaven being the final destination of the faithful, people do not appear to want to die. Joe Louis quotation: "Everybody wants to go to heaven, but nobody wants to die", became so famous that it featured in many songs. I also used to think that anyone who goes to heaven never returns. That was until South African Pastor Paseka Motsoeneng, alias "Prophet Mboro", announced he not only had been on a trip to heaven and returned, but also took photographs using his smartphone! Since he did not say he met people or angels during his trip, he must have taken selfies.

The story did not end there: Mboro is charging those who want to view his heavenly photographs 5,000 rand (\$340) each. In all these cases, people negotiate the road to heaven, or like Mboro, go on tourist tours where they take photographs. But Nigerian Pastor Noah Ade Abraham, actually knows where heaven is and charges a ticket fee of N310,000 per entrant. In his well organised three-stage movement to heaven, he established his operational base in Kaduna, a transit camp in Kabba, Kogi State and a departure camp which he calls the Christ High Commission, in AraromiUgbesi, Omuo-Oke, Ekiti East Local Government Area of Ekiti State. At the departure camp were 40 persons who had met the financial requirements and were waiting for Jesus to descend and meet them.

However, this is not expected

to be a trip as the kingdom

will descend on the transit

camp and it will be transformed into heaven. So like the Jehovah Witnesses preach, heaven is not where you will ascend to or go on a trip through some narrow road or land on an airport; heaven is right here on earth. Meanwhile, Pastor Abraham is yoked with earthly matters as the police charged him for allegedly obtaining money "by false pretence and intent to defraud" by claiming he is capable of taking his followers to heaven. But how can ordinary mortals prove that the pastor is lying? It is like the story of a pastor who asked his followers to fast to death in order to go straight to heaven. When charged for making false claims that he is Jesus, he said if the prosecutor doubted him, it should produce the real

The basic lesson in all these is that nobody should allow another human being to control his mind.

1,872 People Killed, 714 Abducted In **Four Months In 34 States - Report**

Non-Governmental Organisation (NGO) that focuses on human rights and peace building, Stefanos Foundation, has disclosed that between January and April, 2023, there were 217 attacks from 34 states in Nigeria.

According to the Josbased human rights organisation, the attacks resulted in the killing of 1,872 persons, 714 abductions, and 65 sustained various degrees of injuries.

Ms. Fatima Njoku, the Advocacy Manager at Stefanos Foundation, during a joint press briefing in Abuja yesterday, stressed that there is an urgent need for action to address the underlying causes of the violence in parts of the country and the root causes of the violence.

She noted that the situation is so alarming the increase in violence across the nation is a cause for concern, especially as Nigeria is not at war, saying, "From eyewitness reports and testimonies of direct victims across the board, we can say that the attacks are carried out in literally the same style, with attackers dressed in similar fashion and victims with similar profiles. This has happened in Agatu, Guma, Logo in Benue State, Kagoro, Zangon Kataf, Kajuru, Kafanchan in southern Kaduna, Bassa, Riyom, Barkin Ladi, and now Mangu in Plateau State, and the list goes on." She stated that the new

administration has come in at a time when the security of lives and property, which is the primary purpose of government, is at its worst in Nigeria's history, stressing that it calls for the attention of the government for urgent action.

The Mwaghavul Development Association (MDA) in Mangu Local Government Area of Plateau State alleged that the ongoing violence in their communities may be linked to deep economic interests and called for immediate action to address the ongoing violence.

Chief Joseph Gwamkat, MDA's National President, stated that the return to their ancestral homes was nonnegotiable, saying that if

address the situation, there will be "hunger and poverty" in the land, with the present economic climate.

He explained that about 40 per cent of farm produce from Plateau State comes from Mangu LGA, saying that the ongoing violence is a threat to their livelihood.

Gwamkat said the MDA strongly recommends the "establishment of state policing" in all states and communities in Nigeria, and "creation of special courts" to dispense justice between conflicting communities.

He lamented that the presence of the National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA) or the Plateau State Emergency Management Agency has never been felt.
