# **Tinubu Set To Unleash Regime Of Propaganda** As State Policy, Atiku's Aide Alerts Nigerians

Says "fake news regarding lifting visa ban by UAE, tip of iceberg" Expresses hope PDP will reclaim mandate at Supreme Court

n aide to the Presidential candidate of the Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) in 2023, Atiku Abubakar, has raised the alarm over the alleged plans by President Bola Tinubu to unleash a regime of propaganda as a policy of the state in the coming days.

Atiku's Special Assistant on Public Communication, Phrank Shaibu, said in a statement on Sunday, that the fake news regarding the lifting of the visa ban by the United Arab Emirates was just a "tip of the iceberg". Shaibu noted that Tinubu details. It is all propaganda. had already appointed over

15 media aides with the sole aim of pushing misinformation as a policy of state and distracting Nigerians from the deep pains his administration has caused them.

He stressed that this has always been Tinubu's style from his days as governor and leader of his party.

Atiku's aide said, "From information available to us, Bola Tinubu is set to push propaganda to overdrive as he heads out for the United Nations General Assembly. He will claim to have attracted foreign investments amounting to \$100bn but will fail to provide key It is all a load of baloney. In

## Unions Threaten To Shutdown Nuhu Bamalli Polytechnic Over Insecurity, Other Challenges

## \*Give Kaduna Govt ultimatum

he in house unions of Nuhu Bamalli Polytechnic Zaria, Kaduna State, have threatened to withdraw their services over the planned withdrawal of military and other security personnel around the institution.

Comrade Usman-Shehu Sulaiman, Chairman, Academic Staff Union of the Polytechnics (ASUP) Nuhu Bamalli Polytechnic Chapter disclosed this during a joint press conference by the unions on Saturday in Zaria.

Sulaiman said the press conference was to inform the state government, management, parents and other key stakeholders on the security and other challenges hindering academic research, learning and other activities of the institution. He recalled that on June 11, 2021 academic staff, their families and students were abducted at the school.

The abduction forced the state government to

SANI ALIYU, replace the school's security guards with military personnel and some members of Kaduna State Vigilance Service (KADVIS).

According to him, the Military and KADVIS personnel at the institution were planning to leave the college over non-payment of their four months allowances.

`The withdrawal of service by the Military at the school would put everybody at risk of abduction and other criminal acts as there are informants who will leak this development," he said.

He added that, the monthly overhead from the state government was not paid since February which makes so many challenges spring up at the school.

He said the non-payment of the overhead makes the school to delay exams and results presentations, provide identity cards to students and weed control exercises among others.

The union leader said the school was on its 13th week of resumption, it is supposed to commence examinations, but currently, there is no booklet for such examinations.

'We will issue a oneweek ultimatum to the government to address payment of the backlog of allowances to the security; if nothing was no favorable response, we would proceed on strike.

``We would ask our members residing at the staff quarters to find a l t e r n a t i v e accommodation; advise the staff residing off campus to desist from coming to the institution.

'Students would also be advised to remain at home as there will be no guarantee for their safety," he said.

Corroborating, Malam Mahmud Aliyu-Kwarbai, Chairman Non-academic Staff Union (NASU) at the school, said staff members live in constant fear of security breach.

`We don't have functional security in the school, our security was withdrawn and replaced by security personnel from Kaduna (KADVIS).

`The KADVIS personnel attached to the school had left their beat because of the non-payment of their allowances, which lead to serious theft and vandalisation of school

``There was an instance

Officer, Malam Abdullahi Shehu confirmed the development to newsmen, adding that the school management is working towards addressing the identified challenges.

However, Shehu said the Rector, Dr. Mohammed-Kabir Abdullahi has secured payment of the allowances to the military personnel at the school.

## **NSIB** Gives **Reasons Of Improved Air** Safety In Nigeria

he Nigerian Safety Investigation Bureau (NSIB) has said that improved air safety in the country is as a result of the quality of investigations into air accidents, serious accidents and timely release of safety reports.

In the last 10 years, according to the bureau, Nigeria's airspace has only recorded two fatal civil air crashes, resulting to the unfortunate loss of nine souls within the period.

Director-General, NSIB, Engr. Akin Olateru, the Director- General, NSIB, in a paper presented at the 7th African Aviation Summit and Exhibition in Abuja on Friday, tagged: "Nigeria Evolving Approach to Aviation Safety and Learning from Occurrence Investigation," explained that Nigeria has the best aviation safety record in the globe.

He further explained that Nigeria is now a formidable force globally in terms of aviation safety. According to Olateru, "There are plans by the bureau, in collaboration with the Ministry of Aviation and Aerospace Development and the Nigeria Civil Aviation Authority (NCAA), to review and measure the effectiveness of all safety recommendations that had been issued over the years."

He is of the opinion that would help monitor their implementation through the setting up of committees, saying that it would be unveiled in 2024. He opined that the reduction in fatal accidents and serious incidents was not achieved overnight, explaining that in the last four years, Nigeria had only one accident per year in terms of classification.

The Director-General stated that the Bristow Helicopters crash of 2015 and Quorum Helicopters accident of 2019 were the only two civil occurrences in which fatalities were so far recorded within the period.

He stated this while fielding question from newsmen on the recent discovery of the strange Okra disease in Northern Kaduna State and some Southern parts of the

#### country.

Faguji Ishiyaku said on receiving the report of the strange Okra disease, the institute's experts swung into action and revealed that it is a virus that causes the disease.

According to the investigation, the virus is transmitted by some insects which are vectors of the these disease. Also the virus can emanate from a source and it can be an infected source that can come from anywhere.

The Director said, unfortunately, the virus diseases is unlike bacteria, it has no chemical control measures for now.

But as experts advise, the control can be indirectly by conducting a spray on the insects that spread the virus.

Professor Muhammad Faguji Ishiyaku advised farmers to spray the Okra with insecticide that will control those insects from spreading of virus.

"As IAR Scientists have

taken some samples for laboratory testing in order to identify the real virus, farmers were advised to continue with their farming by spraying insecticide with the aim of controlling the spread of the virus".

"Even though the Okra is very healthy for consumption, but next year, farmers should make sure they buy their seed from a seed company ". He further advised.

## Bende Fed Constituency: AA Fumes Over Conflicting Judgment In Abia Elections Petition

he Action Alliance has expressed dismay over the National Assembly Elections Petition Tribunal in Abia State's dismissal of the case instituted by the Action Alliance (AA) against INEC and APC, challenging the election of Benjamin Kalu, Deputy Speaker of the House of Representatives. It would be recalled that Action Alliance led by Adekunle Omo-Aje had petitioned the tribunal following the failure of the Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) to upload the name of its candidate submitted for Bende Federal Constituency of Abia State.

Action Alliance's grievance was the failure of the Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) to upload the name of its candidate submitted for Bende Federal Constituency of Abia State, Ifeanyi Chukwuka.

Buttressing this in his address, Daniel Anya, counsel to the AA candidate, asked the tribunal to annul Kalu's election over the exclusion of the party's name and logo from the ballot during the polls.

The deputy speaker through his counsel, Kelvin Nwufo, however, prayed the court to dismiss the petitions for lacking merit.

While the petition was filed by Omo-Aje-led leadership, the three-member panel of judges led by Samson, Paul-Gang in its judgment, allegedly dismissed the case because another faction of the party led by one Kenneth Udeze said it never filed or authorized anyone to initiate any legal action against Kalu.

"The instant affidavit filed in support is deposed to by one Chief Barrister Kenneth Udeze, the acclaimed National Chairman of the second Petitioner (Action Alliance) while the earlier application filed on 24th July 2023 was deposed to by one IFEANYI CHUKWUKA IGBOKWE," a true copy of one of the judgments obtained by this reporter and signed by Bello Hassan, Principal Registrar of the Tribunal read. "The difference in the two applications is that the first application was deposed to not by the applicant himself but by the National Chairman. Meanwhile, the second application was deposed by the one who bears the name of the first Petitioner, IFEANYI CHUKWUKAIGBOKWE.

"The Petitioners being the Respondents have filed two separate counter affidavits in opposition to the two applications. The earlier application had been argued before and the ruling was reserved till judgment.

"Since the subsequent application was filed after judgment had been reserved, we have seen the need to determine the two applications together at the same time since they are based on the same subject matter. Having adopted their processes before the Tribunal, we are only left with the issue of determining whether this application is grantable or not.

"After the matter was closed before the tribunal and all the

parties in the matter had made their final submissions and the panel of the tribunal was to fix a date to deliver the final judgment on the matter, we were shocked to hear another issue arose about the petition," a top member of AA said.

"While expecting the tribunal to fix a date for the final judgment on the petition filed by the AA, we learnt that the matter was allegedly withdrawn by one Kenneth Udeze, who had since b e e n s u s p e n d e d a n d subsequently expelled from the party.

"Udeze who reportedly withdrew the matter was an impostor and an impersonator as he has no link to the party, having been expelled by the National Convention, which is the highest organ of the party. To our surprise, the purported withdrawal of the petition by the same Udeze who is not recognized by law, nor INEC prompted the tribunal panel made up of Justices Samson, Paul Gang, Kabiru Ibrahim Ahmed, and Abdulfatai Baba Sekoni to dismiss the petition.

"Also, two conflicting judgments were delivered by the tribunal and the two different judgments were gotten by us, Omo-Aje filed a petition before you, but a few days to judgment, an impostor approached the court that he wasn't interested in the case again and the tribunal based its judgment on that, no investigation, a check on INEC website alone would have guided the tribunal that this man isn't the National Chairman of AA."

This reporter gathered that the Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) after the judgment Of the Competence Court gives recognition to Hon Adekunle Rufai Omoaje as the authentic national chairman of the Action Alliance (AA).

To this end, the commission updated its website, with the name of Omoaje appearing as the national chairman of the AA as against the name of one Kenneth Obidiche Udeze who was there before.

## Court Nullifies el-Rufai's Order Banishing Deposed Piriga Paramount Ruler, Zamuna

Kaduna High Court on Tuesday, n u l l i f i e d a Kaduna State government restriction of movement order placed on the deposed paramount ruler of Piriga Chiefdom, Lere Local Government Area of the state, His Royal Highness, Chief Jonathan Parguwa Zamuna.

Delivering judgement on the case of breach of Fundamental Rights, Honourable Justice Nasiru U. Sadiq said the banishing order runs contrary to section 41, subsection 1 of the Constitution of the Federal Republic of Nigeria (as amended) which 'states that every citizen of Nigeria is entitled to move freely throughout Nigeria and to reside in any part thereof, and no citizen of Nigeria shall be expelled from Nigeria or refused entry thereby or exit therefrom'. The Kaduna High Court sitting in Kafanchan, had three weeks ago, nullified similar restriction of movement order placed on the deposed traditional ruler of Arak Chiefdom in Sanga Council Area, His Royal Highness, retired Brigadier General Iliya Yammah.

The court also ordered Kaduna state government to pay Chief Yammah five million Naira damages for breach of fundamental rights.

Immediate past Governor, Malam Nasir Ahmad el-Rufai had on May 22, 2023, announced the deposition of the two paramount rulers, stating "the depositions followed recommendations from the Ministry of Local Government Affairs in line with the provisions of Section 11 of the Traditional Institutions Law No. 21 of 2021", a statement signed by the Commissioner for Local Government Affairs, Hajiya Umma Ahmad, disclosed. Reacting to the court's ruling, the lead Counsel to Chief Zamuna, Barrister Napoleon O. Idenala expressed satisfaction, even though dismayed that the defendants did not

appear in court or counter any of the applicant's claims, having a High Court sitting at Kafanchan, recently declared a similar action of the government as illegal and void.

Barrister Napoleon explained further the magnitude of trauma the deposed chief suffered since the banishment order was placed on him, having lost his wife, brother and sister within a space of four months; however, he reserved comment on whether to appeal the refusal of the court to award any damages despite claiming for 250 million Naira, even though the court found that there was no defence and the claimants fundamental rights had been breached. The lead counsel also stated further, that there is a case of the deposed Chief filed at the National Industrial Court, sitting in Kaduna, praying the court to void his deposition and reinstate him back to his throne because the action of the government in

doing so was arbitrary and without regards to the provisions of the 1999 C onstitution (as amended).

He had filed an action at the National Industrustrial Court sitting in Kaduna, challenging the legality of his deposition.

Upon his deposition, he was more or less banished to his house. Initially, the government wanted to banish him to an unknown house in Unguwan Rimi, Kaduna, which he refused. The government subsequently took him to his own house in Kaduna South and placed him literary under house arrest, by restricting his freedom of movement, with security stationed in front of his house. He gave a chronology of sad event that happened while Chief Zamuna has been on house arrest, saying that someone needs to be in his shoes before he can understand the magnitude of trauma His Highness is going through under the house arrest he

has been subjected to. "It

was barely three weeks after his wife of over forty years died when the government announced his deposition," he explained.

He continued; "While under house arrest, his younger brother took ill and was admitted in a hospital in Abuja; the government denied him permission to visit him; when he later died July, still, he was denied permission to see his remains, yet, his request to attend his burial was denied and until after the burial that he received a letter from the government telling him that he can now attend the burial already done. "After the death of his brother, his nephew also died in Sanga area, yet, he could not attend the burial," he explained. However, the defendant was not in court for their response, as he did not appear in court throughout while the case was heard, till when judgement was delivered.

## Police Arrest Bandit Who Murdered Katsina DPO \*Pedophile, notorious kidnapper,

others also nabbed By; SULAIMAN confessed to the AHMED MISAU, commission of the offense

Katsina e c e n t achievements of Katsina State Command of the Nigeria Police Force in the ongoing fight against all forms of crime and criminalities in the state has led to the arrest of a wanted suspected notorious Armed Bandit, Saidu Yaro "alias Sabon Jini" who conspired with three others to ambush the late Area Police Commander, Dutsinma, Assistant Commissioner of Police (ACP), Aminu Umar in an encounter that led to the deaths of the officer and one another Police officer. The command also arrested a suspected informant to bandits, gunrunner, Ibrahim Abdullahi alias Dogo and recovered four hundred and four (404) rounds of 7.62 MM live ammunition. However, a suspected 65year old pedophile, Haruna Wanzam alias "Baba Tsoho" and a suspected notorious kidnapper, Saminu Usman were also arrested by the Katsina state Police Command.

Parading the suspects before newsmen at the command headquarters in Katsina metropolis, the Police Public Relations Officer (PPRO), Assistant Superintendent of Police (ASP), Abubakar Sadiq Aliyu said, " on September 2, 2023, at about 22:30 hours, based on credible intelligence, the command succeeded in arresting a 35 year old Ibrahim Abdullahi alias Dogo, of Sabon Garin Dunburawa village, Batsari Local Government Area a suspected notorious arms smuggler. ASP Sadiq Aliyu said during the course of the investigation, the suspect was trailed and arrested at Rahamawa quarters. upon instant search, four hundred and four (404) rounds of 7.62mm live ammunition were recovered in his possession. ASP Aliyu disclosed that, in the course of interrogation, the suspect,Ibrahim Abdullahi

c o n f e s s e d to th e commission of the offense and further stated that he received the exhibits alongside one Yakuba, alias Dan Kwandago, of K a n k a r a L o c a l Government Area and one Salisu at Wukari Local Government Area of Taraba State, all at large. "Efforts are on with a view to arresting the fleeing s u s p e c t s a s th e investigation is ongoing," he added.

Similarly, on August 30, 2023, at about 17:30 hours, he said based on credible intelligence, the command succeeded in arresting a 30 year old Saidu Yaro, alias "Sabon Jini," of Tsaskiya Village, Safana Local Government Area, a suspected notorious armed bandit who has been on the command's wanted list for series of offenses such as kidnapping, cattle rustling, and other heinous crimes. ASP Aliyu said nemesis

ASP Anyu said nemesis caught up with the suspect, Sabon Jini when he was arrested in connection with the kidnapping of one Hussaini Nabara, 'm', of Kagara Village, Dutsin-ma Local Government Area.

The PRO further said that, "During the course of the investigation, it was revealed that the suspect, under the command of one Abubakar Jankare, a suspected notorious bandit leader, conspired with one (1) Usman Modi-Modi, 'm', (2) Auta Nokia, 'm', and (3) Sule Malam Aibo, amongst others, now at large, to ambush the late Area Commander Dutsinma, ACP Aminu Umar, in an encounter that led to the deaths of the officer and one other officer (may their souls continue to rest in peace) and the suspect confessed to the commission of the offense." Also, the Command succeeded in arresting a 19-year old Saminu Usman of Tsambe village, Jibia Local Government Area a suspected notorious kidnapper, in connection with a case of kidnapping perpetrated on May 14, 2023, at Tashar Hurera

## Kaduna Govt Set To Promote Open Governance Through Youth Inclusiveness -Commissioner

n its quest to effectively deliver dividends of democracy, Kaduna State Government has once again harped on importance of youth inclusiveness in governance as panacea for transparency and accountability.

This was the position of the Commissioner for Planning and Budget, Mukhtar Ahmed Monrovia at an engagement over the weekend in Kaduna to create awareness on youth participation in politics and governance organized by Open Gov Youth Innovation Hub and Partnership To Engage, Reform and Learn with the support of the United Kingdom.

The commissioner, represented by Tara Jeremiah, Point Of Contact (POC) Open Government Partnership Kaduna State said since the launching of OGP Strategy by United Nations in 2011, key achievements have been recorded globally in promoting transparency and accountability in governance and above all, youth involvement in areas of policy and execution.

He noted that key strategic plans have been implemented by the state government in its drive to enhance timely delivery of infrastructure and improve lives of citizens. "Since 2018 when Kaduna State Government joined the OGP initiative, remarkable feats and progress have been made.

"We have fully implemented our 2021 - 2023 Action Plan, the second and are earnestly preparing for the third one, which I assure you will give teeth to an overall goal of the essence of open governance and all what it entails.

"The principles shall be continuously adhered to for the good, progress and development of our communities," he said.

Earlier, in his remarks, facilitator of the programme Yusuf Ishaku Goje stressed the need for youth to be active in governance, saying it would go a long way in ensuring a better deal for the general populace.

He said youth, due to their significant numbers, should have the leverage of determining the swinging direction of the pendulum in relation to governance.

"We have participants drawn from Kaduna State University, Kaduna Polytechnic, AFIT among others because participation in governance is not taught in schools, which makes our young graduates vulnerable to effects of bad governance within their respective communities.

"We want to change the narratives and negative trends of lack of participation by citizens in governance by creating awareness that could be sustained of making young people see the imperative to getting involved in policymaking process.

Grassroots governance advocate, Sumayya Abdullahi Rigasa added her voice by calling on the female gender to leverage on the opportunity provided by civil societies to increase the number of women participation in politics and governance.

She said, women could no longer be relegated to the background in the scheme of affairs in the country, adding that with their significant number, they could decide their future and those of their children.

## Korea Energy Conference Will Boost Nigeria's Power Sector - Adelabu

inister of Power, Chief LA debayo Adelabu has hinted that Nigeria is set to benefit from the ongoing Korea-Africa Economic Cooperation (KOAFEC 2023) Conference.

The minister disclosed this in Busan, Korea at the ongoing KOAFEC 2023 Ministerial conference.

According to Chief Adelabu, the benefits for Nigeria as a country would be in areas of Energy security, sustainable development, investment opportunities, knowledge sharing and capacity building and clean energy transition.

He maintained that with the increasing global focus on mitigating climate change, the conference provides a platform for discussions on clean energy transition, saying, "This can result in increased foreign direct investment, job creation, and technology transfer in the energy sector".

The minister emphasized that additional benefits from the conference will include knowledge sharing and capacity building, adding, "We will explore collaborations with South Korea to adopt lowcarbon technologies, promote renewable energy deployment, and develop sustainable energy policies".

"This will contribute to reducing greenhouse gas emissions, promoting climate resilience, and achieving the targets of the Paris Agreements. The conference facilitates







Moreover, significant progress is been made to resuscitate the locomotive Train service as rail-lines are on the pipeline to link some parts of the three senatorial

linking Zaria-Kaduna-Sabon Tasha-Kafanchan as part of the 3rd phase (long term) palliative measures to reduce the impact of subsidy removal.

Beyond 100 days, implementing the Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) system as a cost effective, affordable and sustainable mass transit system on the pipeline to cushion the effect of subsidy removal. HEN the Minister of Women Affairs, Uju Kennedy-Ohanenye, said school children should have Fridays as free days to work in producing items such as matchbox, toothpick and sanitary pads, just as they do in China, she probably hasn't reckoned with the amount of backlash her suggestion would receive.

She made the suggestion at the Anambra Investment Summit last week. She said it would create new source of income for families as the items would be sold in local markets, thereby reducing handouts from the government.

Some however equate learning of skills as not for the brilliant, which is probably why some are very sceptical of the minister. It would be as if she was discouraging children from learning and want to derogate them to learning skills or handiwork.

Some say China is not a good example as a country that violates labour laws and why should the minister advocate 'child labour' in violation of international laws? Besides, in this era of innovation and high tech, why should she even think of that, and on and on?

Anyway, it seems that some people want to close their eyes and pretend that they are not living on planet earth, and therefore not aware of the reality on ground, but under the grand illusion of living in some magical world.

After all, who would pretend that there are no child hawkers, where these self-righteous people buy groundnut and banana from or employ them as house-helps?

I watched a feature on a national television recently on out-of-school children in the South East. Many of them said they were hawking to help their parents or to pay school fees when they gather the money. From time to time, people are apprehended at motor parks with many children suspected to be trafficked as house-helps. One woman told me that why some people send their daughters to work as house helps is that after the farming season, they don't have anything to do since they don't go to school. They want to remove those that have started growing up especially, from boys or boyfriends. "They just roam about with nothing to do," she said. Who knows if skills are introduced early, some parents may be more encouraged to put their children in school? And all the unskilled youth in the North that become redundant after the farming season would have learnt something.

Instead, they go to the South and ride achaba or okada, work as gatemen or become shoe shiners, nail cutters and hundreds of such menial jobs that don't pay much and don't add much to the economy.

In those days, school girls were taught needle work in some primary schools. Some would make pillow cases with flowers, some were taught knitting, though not in a larger scale.

Some however equate learning of skills as not for the brilliant, which is probably why some are very sceptical of the minister. It would be as if she was discouraging children from learning and want to derogate them to learning skills or handiwork.

Whatever the case may be, even if we are aiming for the stars in terms of high tech, we should not disregard that there are many unskilled and redundant people that need to be engaged and for them to get some money as well. And starting early is not a bad idea.

It is because of this mindset that one woman said she didn't like her son to make shoes. He was a graduate, but he was interested in making shoes. She said she felt that that type of skills was meant for the physically challenged!

In any event, unless we also want to pretend, how many small boys have we seen with mechanics, tailors and so on as apprentices? Some even organise some sort of graduation ceremonies they call 'freedom', which means you have learned enough to be on your own. Some of them don't go to school

## Moroccan Earthquake: A Monumental Disaster And A Monarch's Parochial Politics

HE six-point-eight earthquake that hit the High Atlas mountain range of the Moroccan Kingdom last Friday claimed 2,901 lives and injured 5,530. The number of casualties is likely to rise, and we may never know how many more will die. Also, quite tragically, we may never know how many might have survived had the Moroccan government not played the parochial politics of rejecting help from friends and foes alike except Spain, Qatar, the United Arab Emirates, and the United Kingdom. Even the quartet had to wait for two days before receiving the green light to deploy. When an earthquake occurs, it is an emergency, and every second counts as it is a race against time. In fact, after the first 24 hours, the chances of finding survivors begin to dim as victims may be trapped with life-threatening injuries and may die unless they are not only quickly rescued but also given emergency treatment. There is what is called the 72-hour "golden period" for saving lives, after which hope of finding survivors is lost.

Despite such differences, immediately after the earthquake occurred, Algeria offered to come across the border to aid the victims and save lives. The Moroccan government, through its Justice Minister, Abdellatif Ouahabi, like any reasonable government would, accepted the offer, but with the caveat that the aid be delivered in coordination with the Moroccan Foreign Ministry. Based on this, Algeria opened its airspace for humanitarian flights and mobilised 80 emergency personnel and three military aircraft carrying humanitarian aid. After waiting for two days, a counter-order came, rejecting the Algerian offer.

So, quick and immediate rescue is crucial, as some victims may be trapped in places with little oxygen, others may be weighed down by debris, or they may even be faced with amputation. This is more so in the Moroccan case, in which collapsing buildings have been mainly responsible for many of the casualties. Also, all some may need to survive is water. There is also the matter of aftershocks. So, any assistance available must be grabbed, as life has no duplicate. In many cases, an earthquake victim is like a drowning person, who, as a British proverb says, will clutch at a straw. Therefore, the decision of Moroccan King Mohammed VI to reject almost all aid after the quake struck, based on claims of the need to maintain the country's sovereignty and ensure "co-ordination", is playing parochial politics and constitutes a crime against the quake victims. What can the dying Moroccan trapped under rubble care about his country's sovereignty? All he needs is to be rescued, irrespective of the colour, religion, or political persuasion of his rescuer. It would not even matter to him if his

rescuer was a dog.

Algeria is Morocco's neighbour, and both countries are virtually the same: Ninety-nine per cent of Algerians are Arabs and Berbers, while 98 per cent of Moroccans are Arabs and Berbers. In fact, Ahmed Ben Bella, the revolutionary who was Algeria's founding president, was the child of Moroccan migrants. However, both countries differ on the status of the Saharawi of Western Sahara, another country with mainly Berber stock. While Morocco occupies most of Western Sahara, claiming it as part of its

kingdom, Algeria insists that the Saharawi, who are the brothers and sisters of both countries, should be allowed the freedom to run their country.

Despite such differences, immediately after the earthquake occurred, Algeria offered to come across the border to aid the victims and save lives. The Moroccan government, through its Justice Minister, Abdellatif Ouahabi, like any reasonable government would, accepted the offer, but with the caveat that the aid be delivered in coordination with the Moroccan Foreign Ministry. Based on this, Algeria opened its airspace for humanitarian flights and mobilised 80 emergency personnel and three military aircraft carrying humanitarian aid. After waiting for two days, a counter-order came, rejecting the Algerian offer. The rejection was in line with King Mohammed VI's view stated in a speech in 2022: "The Sahara issue is the lens through which

Morocco looks at the world."

France, which had colonised Morocco but h a d subsequently become a close ally, offered immediate assistance. But France had recently angered the Moroccan monarchy when, unlike the United States and Israel, it declined to recognise Western Sahara as part of Morocco. The latter's reaction to France's aid offer was a total

rejection, lamented: "... We are here and we are able to provide direct humanitarian aid... We will be there in the long term on a humanitarian and medical level for reconstruction, cultural and heritage aid, and in all areas where the Moroccan people and the government consider that we will be useful." It released five million euros in aid to Moroccan NGOs for relief work.

Rescuers Without Borders, a non-state French organisation, was also unable to enter Morocco. Its founder, Arnaud Fraisse, told the media: "Unfortunately, we still don't have the go-ahead from the Moroccan government... All of our team members who train regularly year-round for this type of thing are miserable that they couldn't leave and put their skills to use."

Morocco also snubbed Germany, which had assembled a 50-person team from its Technical Relief Agency that had

gathered at Cologne airport for a flight to Morocco. Germany has, like France, fallen foul of Morocco's insistence that its colonisation of Western Sahara must be accepted. To this snub, the Chair of the German Parliament Group on the Maghreb responded: "It i s incomprehensible that Rabat has so far forgone German help... The current situation should not b e about misunderstood national pride." Vladimir Vlcek, the Director General of a Czech rescue service that assembled a 70person team, said the

reason they were denied permission "could be political, religious, or any other reason".

A puzzle is why Morocco snubbed the United States, which has not only supported its skewed foreign policy but whose immediate past President Donald Trump had also 'donated' Western Sahara to it.

There may be brewing problems between them that are not apparent, but what is clear is the Moroccan monarch's macabre foreign policy dance. For instance, after its deviant attitude led to the collapse of the Arab Maghreb Union (AMU), rather than mend fences and try to revive it, Morocco, which is in North Africa, applied to join the Economic Community of West African States (ECOWAS).

When the Organisation of African States rejected its attempts to recolonise Western Sahara after the Spanish colonisers left. Morocco stormed out of the continental body, returning on January 31, 2017, after 33 years in the cold. So, rather than accept badly needed international aid, Morocco prefers its citizens to use pick axes and their bare hands to dig concrete rubble. The aid intended for Morocco could well go to Libya, where on September 10, 2023, Storm Daniel hit, resulting in 5,300 deaths, about 10,000 missing and neighbourhoods washed away by floodwaters. ## NDLEA/Lagos SWAN Symposium On Drug Abuse: Experts Warn Nigerian Athletes Against Doping

By; AYO OJEDOKUN, Lagos igerian athletes across various sporting disciplines have been warned to desist from taking drugs to enhance their performance for results as this could spell doom for, not only their career, but their health, families and the image of the country.

This was the submission of various speakers at the symposium organised by the Lagos State Chapter of the Sports Writers Association of Nigeria (SWAN) in partnership with the National Drug Laws EnforcementAgency (NDLEA). The symposium, which was the first of its kind in the history of the sports writing family in Nigeria, was held at the Golfview Suites and Conference Center in Ikeja, Lagos, South West Nigeria on Wednesday. It had as its title, "Workshop Symposium Against the Use of Illicit Substances, Drug Abuse and Doping".

The event was also made possible through the support from the Lagos State Ministry of Health, NAFDAC, Federal Ministry of Sports Development, Nigeria Olympic Committee (NOC) Golfview Suites and Conference Center and National Anti-Doping Committee NADC. Chairman of Lagos SWAN, Ms Olatutu Oladunni commended the NDLEA for believing in the platform provided by SWAN for the agency to advocate against drug abuses among Nigerian athletes at a period when dope case is rampant in world sports.

While commending the leadership of the NDLEA headed by Brig. Gen (Rtd) Buba Marwa, the Lagos State Government, the NAFDAC, National Anti-Doping Committee and other partners that made the symposium a success, Oladunni noted that media would go a long way in pushing the war against drugs and illicit substances deeper into the grassroots in the country. She assured that Lagos SWAN would continue to support the fight. Zonal Director, Zone H of the NDLEA, Dr, Segun Oke, who declared the workshop open on behalf of the Chairman and CEO of the NDLEA, Brig. Gen (Rtd) Buba Marwa noted that the reason athletes engage in doping for any competition is to take advantage to win a laurel, and "it is like bringing another person to win a medal. Using drugs for any



tournament is like the athletes' sourcing for artificial success which is more or less cheating," Dr Oke said.

The NDLEA's Director warned that doping brings with it artificial problems, disgrace and embarrassment, adding that Nigerian athletes should play their sports clean by not engaging in drugs before or during competitions.

To Dr Gbenga Olowo, Chairman, SABRE West Africa and Central Africa Republic, who was a special guest of honour at the occasion, he berated the use of drugs to win laurels by sportsmen and women, warning that athletes don't need to take drugs as there are alternatives to making money in sports, even as he called on the Nigerian government to look deeply into sports tourism where monetary revenue can be generated to the nation. "It is unfortunate that tourism could only generate about one per cent of our GDP. This is not good considering what most countries across the world are making from tourism. I want the present government to focus more on tourism, especially sports tourism," Olowo said. ACGN Umar Isah Adoro, the State Commander, NDLEA, Lagos State Command, who was

glad about the inspiration that brought about the symposium, hailed the leadership of Lagos SWAN for reaching out to the NDLEA for the organisation of the programme.

According to him, the platform of sports, which has been a unifying factor of Nigerian people over the years, is a veritable ground for the NDLEA to advocate its war against drugs in Nigeria.

"Our athletes have been very good ambassadors of the nation, and we would not want to see them cutting corners to win laurels. This is dangerous and the multiplier effects have always been worrisome and deadly," he warned. the National Anti-Doping Committee emphasised the dangerous consequences of doping to the athletes and the nation in his presentation titled, "Doping and Its Consequences in Sports", and warned that it pays for the athletes to win on a clean slate than cheat with drugs.

The NDLEA's presentation at the workshop symposium was delivered by DCN Chinyerem Eziaghighala, the Deputy Commander, Drug Demand Reduction, NDLEA Lagos State Command, where the officer elaborated the significance of the NDLEAs intervention in the spread of drug abuses in the country with the testimonial that the agency has been able to check this spread and enforce the laws against narcotics in the country. According to her, the NDLEA will continue to record success in its works with the support of Nigeria and especially the media. Other speakers at the symposium talked extensively about the dangers inherent in the abuses of drugs and doping in sports. One of the speakers is Dr Joy Mayaki, a senior lecturer at the National Institute for Sports (NIS), who holds a Ph.D. in Exercise and Sports Psychology. She is the Vice President of the Nigeria Sports Coaches Association, Treasurer of the National

Association for Physical and Health Education, Recreation, Sports and Dance (NAPHERSD) and Treasurer of the National Association for Women in Sports (NAWIS).

Dr. Mayaki talked about Drug Use and Misuse: An Alternative Look to Combating the Scourge. Others are Pharm. Mrs. Simisola Opanuga from the Lagos State Ministry of Health. She is the Secretary of the Lagos State Inter-Ministerial Drug Abuse Control Committee. She spoke on the Prevention Science of Drug Abuse.

The duo of Dr. Adebukola Bojuwoye and Dr Tajudeen Sule who are from the Ministry of Health but attached to the Lagos State Sports Commission spoke on the History of Doping in Sports, Doping in Sports New Era, Drug Abuse and Doping in Sports the Relationship and Illicit Substances. The audience who included athletes, coaches, officials, journalists, NAFDAC officers and a team of NDLEA officers from the Lagos State Command, were enthusiastic about the topics of discussion, and it was generally agreed that while the Nigerian athletes are good at their respective sporting activities, they should refrain from cheating through doping as this could endanger their lives.

Commander Usman WADA, the Airport Commander, NDLEA, Lagos was of the opinion that many athletes who take drugs are doing it out of ignorance, adding that officials, most especially the coaches, may have lured them into believing that they are taking substances that would help them.

"It is very alarming with the way the youths involve in drugs and illicit substances these days, the NDLEA has not been resting on its oars, as we are winning the war," he said.

## Excitement Galore As BSFA, State Government Launch 'Football For All' Initiative In Benue

The initiative designed by the Benue State Football Association (BSFA) is aimed at ensuring that massive footballs are made available and distributed across the state at a low cost.

Launching the initiative in Makurdi, the state capital, Commissioner for Youth, Sports and Creativity, Rt. Hon. Ikyange Terkimbi, commended BSFA leadership, led by the Chairman, Barr. Paul Edeh, for its unpredictable passion and commitment in driving football development at the grassroots.

He said while other sporting groups and associations only send in requests of the things they want government to do for them, Benue FA has led the way in pursuing a vigorous footballing system geared towards taking the youth off the street and engaging them meaningfully.

Citing the ongoing FA Cup tournament at all 23 local government areas (LGAs) across the state, the Commissioner who was a Speaker, Benue State House of Assembly, reckoned that with the tempo at which football is currently being administered, other sports will take a cue to revive the sector which had gone moribund.
