547,774 Candidates Jostle For Police Recruitment 5 Weeks To Deadline

ive weeks into closure of recruitment portal, Police Service Commission (PSC) has said that it has so far, received a total of five hundred and seven thousand, seven hundred and seventy four (547,774) applications for recruitment into the Constable cadre of the Nigeria Police Force.

Ikechukwu Ani, Head of Press and Public Relations who stated this in a statement issued yesterday, said that

November 26, 2023 will complete the mandatory six weeks requirement for the exercise by Federal Character Commission (FCC), having opened portal on October 15, 2023. According to Mr Ani, a total of 358,900 out of the 547,774 applicants were successful and have qualified for the next round of the recruitment process which includes the physical, credentials, medicals and strict background checks of the applicants.

He said, Kaduna State maintains its first position as the state with the highest number of applicants with 40,272 with Anambra Still stuck in the last position with 1664. Adamawa State is second with 36.398 applications, Bornu State third with 32,048. Benue State with 31,122 is fourth, Katsina State with 30,202 is 5th, Bauchi State with 30,604 is 6th while Kano with 30,004 is 7th.

Ebonyi State with 2,132

applications is next to Anambra from the rear, followed by Lagos State with 2,324 applicants. Bayelsa State is 4th from the rear with 2,651 while Abia has 2,796 and 5th from the rear.

The Head of Press and Public Relations said that the Chairman of the Commission, IG Solomon Arase (rtd), has expressed satisfaction with the number of applications already received, describing it as a show of incredible interest of Nigerian youths in pursuing thier career in Nigeria Police.

His words, "Dr. Solomon Arase, CFR, retired Inspector General of Police expressed his satisfaction with the number of applications already received. He observed that it is obvious that Nigerian youths have decided to show incredible interest in pursuing a career in the Nigeria Police, a development he said augurs well for the new Police we are building".

Dr Arase according to Ani, has appealed once again to the youths of the South-East to change its indifference to Police work, insisting that embracing antigovernment criminal gangs will not lead them anywhere.

The Commission Boss advised that they should be concerned on what becomes of the region in the future as no development can thrive in a terror ravaged communities.

He noted that the commission would do its best to ensure that the recruitment was strictly based on defined criteria with merit and justice prevalent throughout the processes.

FCTA Development Control Director Hails House Of Reps Dismissal Of Frivolous Petition

he House of Representatives has thrown out a petition by a group against the Director of the Department of Development Control of the Federal Capital Territory Administration (FCTA), Town Planner, Muktar Galadima.

The House dismissed the petition as the petitioner failed to show up to defend the petition.

At the case listed among those to be treated by the house committee on Thursday November 16, 2023. The Director and his counsel, Alkali Adamu Askira Esq were at the venue, room 429 before the 1pm slated time. Sadly, the petitioner was nowhere to be found.

The chairman of the House of Representatives committee on Public Petition, Honourable Mike Etaba subsequently threw out the petition.

Speaking to newsmen on the matter, counsel to the director, Alkali Adamu Askira Esq said, "We filed our defense and produced ten hard copies and one soft copy as demanded by the committee. Precisely by 2pm the clerk called the case but to our great dismay the petitioners failed to appear nor their counsel"

Speaking further he said, "As lawyers, we are minister in the temple of justice, we shouldn't appear to be on the side of injustice no matter what. When a matter is adjourned in your presentlee, it means you have dully served with notice of the next sitting, but failure to appear without any reasons

is like you abandon the petitions."

He praised the chairman and members of the committee, saying that they are absolutely right in striking out the petitions.

He disclosed that, "if not the committee are quasi administrative body, we would have asked for five million Naira cost for wasting our precious time to respond to this malicious petitions that lack merits in all it's ramifications".

He thanked the committee's chairman and members for not allowing their, "noble office to be used as a platform of dragging good name of public servants down to the mud".

On his part, the Director of Development Control Department, Town Planner Muktar Galadima says with this petition thrown out he can now focus on his job with no distraction

In his words, "Abuja is growing too fast and the challenges of ensuring proper development is very heavy. Petitions like this are very distracting. The time one would spend in vetting and approving building plans should not be spent in reading and responding to frivolous petitions such as this one.

"I can now spend time with my team and colleagues in the department to monitor building construction, correct contraventions and remove illegalities where the need arises".

He praised the lawmakers for the decision, while calling on the petitioner to devote his or her energy on meaningful and fruitful ventures.

NDLEA Apprehends Fleeing Notorious Drug Lord Seven Years After Jail Break, 28 Others

he long arm of the law has caught up with a notorious drug dealer following his arrest by operatives of the National Drug Law Enforcement Agency (NDLEA) seven years after escaping from prison custody.

Twenty eight others, including a female were also arrested in Ekiti, Ondo, Sokoto, Benue, Ogun and Imo States, and 63,767.3kgs of cannabis, 82,320 pills of opioids recovered in raids across 8 states.

Identified as Ibrahim Momoh, popularly known as Ibrahim Bendel, the fleeing ex- convict was said to have been found guilty and convicted for drug dealing before his escape from custody.

Described as a notorious major distributor of illicit substances within the Federal Capital Territory, the drug lord was said to have been arrested by operatives of the National Drug Law Enforcement Agency, NDLEA during a raid of his hideout at Filin Dabo, Dei-Dei area of the FCT.

In a statement yesterday, the Director, Media & Advocacy of the narcotics agency, Femi Babafemi revealed how Ibrahim Momoh was first arrested on 27th November, 2014 with cannabis sativa weighing 385.1kgs, prosecuted, convicted and sentenced to seven and a half years in prison on 22nd July 2015 but while serving his jail term at Kuje, escaped from prison custody on 16th May, 2016.

According to him, "Following credible intelligence, NDLEA operatives on 20th November 2022 stormed the warehouse of the fleeing ex-convict, Ibrahim

Momoh, and recovered 81 jumbo bags of cannabis weighing 1,278kgs. The store was located within his poultry farm in Dei-Dei area of the FCT. Though Momoh was not around at the time, his warehouse manager, 55-year-old Ghanaian, Richard Forson Gordon was arrested, prosecuted and sentenced to two years in jail. The Agency thereafter declared Ibrahim Momoh wanted.

"The manhunt for the drug lord paid off on 5th November 2023 when operatives again raided his hideout at Filin Dabo, Dei-Dei area of Abuja where he was arrested with 56.9kgs of cannabis sativa and 42.7 grams of Diazepam. In another raid in the same area of the FCT on Monday 13th November, a suspect Yusufa Ibrahim, 27, was arrested with 75.3kgs of cannabis.

Meanwhile, a massive operation in the forest of Efon Alaye in Efon local government area of Ekiti state on Saturday 18th November 2023 has led to the destruction of 52,500 kilograms of cannabis sativa covering over 21 hectares of farmland while a total of ninety two bags of same substance weighing 1,380 kilograms were recovered and another 250 bags weighing 3,000kgs stored in different huts on the farm were also burnt.

No fewer than 15 suspects were arrested on the farm during the operation. They include: Okikiri Julius, 27; Ozoemene Friday Efajemu, 31; Tosin Ibrahim, 18; Israel Samuel, 25; Godwin David, 39; Friday Isaac, 19; Ayomide Igbekele, 18; Joshua Daniel, 27; Emmanuel Nwachukwu, 19; Emeka Onyeama, 31; Ani Augustine, 27; Obasi Ogbu, 32; Orsusue Peter, 23; Daniel Emmanuel, 18;

and Yinusa James, 22.

In Ondo state, five persons including another wanted drug kingpin, Christopher Onyebuchi, 40, were arrested at New Bridge Compound, Idoani on Wednesday 15th November and a total of 1,945 kilograms of cannabis recovered from

them. Others include: Olorunda Ojo, 52; Femi Tomoye, 22; Abdurahman Salahu, 29; and Momoh Jimoh, 31. Onyebuchi had earlier been arrested by NDLEA on 25th March 2022 with 89kgs of same substance but jumped bail after he was arraigned at the Federal High Court, Akure.

Operatives in the state also on Sunday 12th Nov raided Upemen village in Owo where they recovered 1,834kgs of same substance with 273kgs also seized the previous day, Saturday 11th Nov at Ipesi Akoko.

While NDLEA officers in Sokoto recovered 290kgs of cannabis from a female suspect, Fatima Salmanu, 20, at Gangaren Tashar, Illela Sokoto in Sokoto North LGA on Thursday 16th Nov, their colleagues in Edo state evacuated 808kgs of the same psychoactive substance stored in a forest at Igueben on Monday 13th Nov.

Not less than 231kgs of cannabis were recovered and five suspects arrested in a joint raid between NDLEA operatives and soldiers in Kwande council area of Benue

state on Monday 13th Nov. Those arrested include: Denen Terhemba, 25; Liambee Iorhuna, 36; Iorhuna Sughnen, 20; Aboh Sonter, 23; and Msendoo Tyokaa, 36.

While operatives in Ogun state on Tuesday 14th Nov arrested a suspect, Tony Jonah at Abule Iroko, with cannabis sativa weighing 67kgs, those in Lagos arrested Chike Agu at Ago Palace way, Isolo with 364.3kgs of Loud, a variant of cannabis.

In Imo state, NDLEA operatives on patrol along Owerri -Onitsha expressway on Monday 13th Nov intercepted a truck marked XS 669KRD driven by one Orji Ifeanyi, 33. A search of the truck led to the seizure of 82,320 pills of opioids including Tramadol 225mg, and Diazepam as well as 32.5 litres of codeine cough syrup and 100 pieces of Molly weighing 49.62 grams.

The War Against Drug Abuse, WADA, advocacy campaign of the Agency continued in equal measure in schools, markets, worship places and others across the country in the past week. Some of them include: WADA advocacy lecture for Muslim faithful at Badagry Central

Mosque, Badagry, Lagos; WADA sensitisation lecture for students of Government Science College, Wase, Plateau state; WADA sensitisation lecture for students of Anglican Girls Secondary School, Ogidi, Anambra state; WADA advocacy lecture at St. Thomas Grammar School, Otan Aiyegbaju, Osun; WADA advocacy lecture for students and staff of Government Junior Arabic Secondary School, Maigatari, Jigawa state as well as students and staff of Mainland Technical College, Oron, Akwa Ibom state.

While commending the officers and men of the FCT, Ekiti, Ondo, Sokoto, Lagos, Edo, Benue, Ogun and Imo Commands for the arrests and seizures of the past week, Chairman/Chief Executive Officer of NDLEA, Brig. Gen. Mohamed Buba Marwa (Retd) urged them and their compatriots across all formations of the Agency to intensify the offensive action tempo against drug cartels as the yuletide season approaches while maintaining a balance with their drug demand reduction efforts.

Two Police Officers Gunned Down In Ebonyi **As Armed Hoodlums Launch Attack**

bonyi State Police Command has **d**confirmed the attack and killing of two operatives of the command on patrol at Nwofe road at the outskirt of Abakaliki, who were attacked by armed hoodlums using a tinted Highlander vehicle with registration number unknown.

According to the statemenr by the command's Public Relations Officer, SP O n o m Onovewakpoyeya, the incident occurred around 8:30am on Friday,

November 17, 2023.

She further explained that two of the operatives were killed, while one is currently receiving medical treatment at the hospital.

The Commissioner of Police also visited the scene of the incident with her management team for on the spot assessment and used the medium to call on well meaning individuals of the state to avail the command with useful information that can lead to the arrest of the fleeing hoodlums, while assuring them of round the clock visibility patrol of the nooks and crannies of the state.

The press release reads in parts, "Today 17/11/2023 at about 08:30am, Operatives of the Command on patrol at Nwofe road at the outskirt of Abakaliki were attacked by armed hoodlums suspected to be IPOB/ESN members using a tinted Highlander vehicle with registration number unknown.

`Two (2) of the Operatives were fatally wounded while one (1) is currently receiving medical treatment at the hospital.

'The Commissioner Of police, Ebonyi state police Command, CP Augustina Ogbodo Psc on receiving the distress call,

immediately dispatched Tactical teams to the scene, who equally swung into action by giving the hoodlums a hot chase but the hoodlums escaped.

Unidentified Persons Attack, Injure, Former Governor Matawalle's Censorship Board Chairman, Children In Jos

ome yet-to-be identified persons on Friday morning, attacked and wounded an ardent supporter of former governor of Zamfara State, Dr. Bello Muhammad, Matawallen Maradun, Sani Nasiru Makari, alongside his two children in Jos, Plateau State.

Sani Nasiru Makari was the chairman, Zamfara State Censorship Board during the immediate past administration of Governor Matawalle.

The incident which occurred in the early hours of Friday in Makari's residence in Jos, left the victims seriously wounded.

According to an eye witnesses, Sani was shot at with a gun by one of the attackers, but the bullet missed its target, and bruised one of his sons in the head.

According to the witnesses, one of Sani's daughters was also stabbed with a sharp knife by one of the attackers when she held him crying and shouting at him to leave her father alone.

"When he was unable to shoot his victim, the attacker then used a sharp knife to stab him".

One of the eye-witnesses said the attackers came to the residence of the victim in a black Mercedes Benz; broke the gate and forced themselves into the house and started shooting indiscriminately.

The victims', Sani Makari and his two children are currently in a nearby health facility receiving treatment.

This is the second time the victim would be attacked by unidentified gunmen.

Sani Makari was alleged to have recently engaged in social media criticism of the present administration of Governor Dauda Lawal.

Kaduna Joins North West States At Code d'Ivoire To Seek AfDB's Intervention In Power, Agriculture

aduna State Deputy Governor, Dr Hadiza Sabuwa Balarabe joined the governors of the North West zone at a meeting with the African Development Bank (AfDB) in Abidjan, Cote d'Ivoire as part of a regional effort to seek AfDB's intervention in agriculture and power.

The governors, who met with the team from the African Development Bank led by the President, Dr Akinwumi Adesina, presented a regional approach developed by the seven states to position the region to better utilize the opportunities offered by the Bank's Agro-Industrial Processing Zones Programme.

In her presentation at the meeting, Dr. Hadiza assured the AfDB's president of Kaduna State's commitment to the

collective vision of the northwest region, stating that the participation of Kaduna State in the discussions underscores the critical importance the administration of Governor Uba Sani places on fostering collaborations and partnerships for the advancement of the different sectors of the economy, especially the agricultural and power sectors, which she describes as "foundational pillars of our regional growth and development".

Dr Balarabe stated that agriculture remains the fulcrum of Governor Uba Sani's development agenda. "We are endowed with vast arable land and resources. With support from the African Development Bank, we aim to modernize agricultural practices, enhance value addition to our produce, and empower our farmers with the knowledge and tools needed

for higher productivity. We are also concerned with the rural infrastructure that our farmers need to enhance their profitability.

"The criticality of the power sector to our vision cannot be downplayed, It is an indispensable enabler of economic growth and industrialization. We cannot put aside the fact that an adequate and reliable power supply is fundamental to attracting investments and fostering entrepreneurship while enabling and ensuring the success of our industries. It is in recognition of the transformative potential of a robust power infrastructure, that we seek and need credible partnerships to strengthen our energy capabilities and promote renewable sources, while also addressing challenges that have hindered our progress thus far.

The deputy governor further

called for AfDB's intervention in Kaduna State under the National Transmission Expansion Project to energize a 2 by 60MVA transmission substation for the Green Economic Zone, pointing out that Kaduna State has already conducted pre-feasibility studies for energizing 5000 off-grid communities. "We have done deep dives and investor pitch for 2 clusters of 42 communities and what remains is for them to be powered now", Dr Balarabe said. She added that "Kaduna State Government welcomes the intervention of the AfDB in the Special Agro-Industrial Processing Zones program even as she disclosed that Kaduna is ready to move on with this project with the support of the AfDB to site a 2nd SAAIZ project in a different Zone of the State because of the peculiarities inherent in the State.

She expressed optimism that the

Special Agro-allied industrial zone will assist the state in overcoming major challenges just as it will serve to propel Kaduna towards achieving food self-sufficiency, job and wealth creation, and subsequently boost economic growth, especially the rural economy.



to avoid breaking the

fabrics of the society. In his words, "I want to plead that you use the media, to engender a new template of reportage, one that is developmentaloriented, where our leaders are called to account without being overly obtrusive. No one desire a plaint media that act like the cheer-leaders to the government, but in trying to break the news, we should be careful not to break the fabric of the society. You need the nation first in order to freely practice your profession.

"Permit me to say that the

growth of any society is predicated on how such a society is being defined, its national ethos, characteristics, identity and defining values. If there is the constant dribdrib of negative reportage, where the challenges of the process of our nationbuilding are overly magnified and our symbols of authority, randomly demonized and our potentials routinely talked down on, in spite of how large such a market may be, foreign investors will be wary of coming to such a volatile environment." He stated.

The governor described the theme of the conference, "Stimulating Economic Growth, Technological Advancement: Role of the Media" as apt and timely to to address some concerned issues in media practice professionalism.

He acknowledged and thanked the media for the support given him so far since his assumption of office and carefully rolled out his achievements in various key sectors including education, agriculture, rural development, aviation, security advancement, among others.

Court Restrains Gov Adeleke, OSHA Others From Removing Osun CJ, **Judicial Commission Secretary**

he National Industrial Court, La Ibadan Division on Thursday, restrained Governor Ademola Adeleke, the Osun State House of Assembly, the Attorney-General, the Accountant General and the Osun State Judicial Service Commission from removing, suspending the Chief Judge and Secretary to the Osun State Judicial Service Commission by Justice Bola Adepele Ojo and Mr Obidiya.

Justice J. D. Peters of the National Industrial Court gave the order while ruling on the separate suits filed by Chief Judge of Osun state and Mr Obidiya n u m b e r e d NICN/IB/60/2023 and NICN/IB/61/2023 respectively at Ibadan Division.

The judge in the ruling in the motion ex parte after hearing Oladipo Olasope SAN for applicant with O. G. lge restrained the defendants from and or otherwise tampering with the enjoyment of the Offices of the Chief Judge and Secretary to the Osun State Judicial Service Commission by Justice Bola Adepele Ojo and Mr Obidiya pending the hearing of the applications on notice of the plaintiffs.

The rulings were delivered on 15th and November 16, 2023, by Hon Justice J. D. Peters in in the separate suits filed by the said Chief Judge and Mr Obidiya and n u m b e r e d NICN/IB/60/2023 and NICN/IB/61/2023 respectively at Ibadan Division.

"An order of interim injunction is issued restraining the Defendants by themselves or their agents or privies howsoever so-called from interfering with

removing, reversing or terminating the appointment and conditions of service of the applicant as the Secretary of the Osun State Judicial Service including but not limited to salaries and other pecuniary benefits pending the determination of the interlocutory application.

"An order of interim injunction is here issued restraining the Defendants from appointing Mrs. Abosede Fagbola to the position of secretary of the Judicial Service Commission and or giving effect to the circular issued by the Defendants dated 711) November 2023 transfering the said Mrs Abosede Fagbola to the Judicial Service.

"The 4th Defendant, Accountant General of Osun State, is here ordered and directed to continue to pay the salary, entitlements, emoluments, remuneration and other benefits and moneys the claimant is entitled to as the secretary of Osun State Judicial Service Commission pending the determination of the interlocutory application." Justice Peters stressed, ' Let me add because I feel it is important for me to so add that it is safe for me to and I do take Judicial notice of the obvious fact that His Excellency Governor Ademola Adeleke of Osun State is a beneficiary of the Judiciary and the Rule of Law. Thus I-lis Excellency would ensure compliance with this order by all and sundry in his administration.

" I direct that this order together with the motion on notice and all other processes in this case be served on the Defendants immediately. It was learnt that the dead body of Ms Gbenle was found with her hands and legs tied on Friday morning with the dress she wore on Thursday on her, while the assailants escaped with her two vehicles, phones and Automated Teller Machine (ATM) cards.

The assailants were said to have stormed late Gbenle's residence few hours after she reported an alleged

marijuana close to her house.

According to sources, the late Permanent Secretary was billed to host a meeting of retired permanent secretaries and heads of service in Oyo State on Thursday, November 16.

Already, the Association of Retired Heads of Service and Permanent Secretaries of Oyo and Osun States (AREHSPSOOS) in a condolence message, described the late retired Permanent Secretary as, " not only a loyally committed member of the association; she served on the last Executive Committee demonstrably!"

The condolence message, signed by the association's chairman, Chief Bisi Adesola, reads, "With the greatest

threat to her life to the police that her sore regrets, I, on behalf of the life was being threatened by some Executive Committee of the hoodlums who used to smoke Association of Retired Heads of Service and Permanent Secretaries of Oyo and Osun States, (AREHSPSOOS), announce the untimely death of Ms Elizabeth Olaniyan Gbenle".

"She was not only a loyally committed member of the Association; she served on the last Executive Committee demonstrably ably! Due to this sad event, our 16th November 2023 Quarterly meeting is hereby cancelled!. Further details on her funeral services shall be communicated as soon as they are made available to us by the family!"

As at the time of sending this report. reliable police sources hinted that investigations is on going on the incident by detectives from Oyo State Police Command.



Niger Govt Signs MOU With Alternative Bank On Sustainable Development

iger State Government has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), with the Alternative Bank on sustainable development of the state.

The signing of the MOU which was done in Abuja, was on some basic segments of the economy, such as, education, health, agriculture, transportation, energy, and infrastructure among others.

Governor Mohammed Umaru Bago signed on behalf of the state government, while the Executive Director of the Alternative Bank, Garba Mohammed, signed for the financial institution.

The governor who expressed delight with the financial institution for its readiness to partner the State government, said the state will maximize the opportunity to harness its agricultural potential.

Governor Umaru Bago who observed that the state has not been able to cultivate up to 1% of its arable land, disclosed that the state government intends to procure some earth moving equipment like caterpillar, bulldozers, pale loaders graders on a long lease to prepare land for cultivation of about 4.5m hectares which is half of it cultivable land in the next 10 years.

He further announced that the state is discussing with Almarai; a Saudi multinational dairy company for the production of Alfalfa plant havens discovered the economic value of the plant, adding that the protein content of the plant will be studied with a view to

getting better seedlings for planting.

The governor then directed his Deputy Chief of Staff and the Chairman, Niger Foods Limited to liaise with the Financial Institution to achieve the desired result of the collaboration.

In his remarks, the Executive Director of the Alternative Bank, Garba Mohammed, explained that the Financial Institution has created multi-million U.S dollar opportunities for Agricultural investment in the State.

He said an international partner has expressed willingness to invest 65 million U.S dollars to have a sugarcane plantation on five hectares of land in the State, with an estimated output of 50,000 tonnes of sugar annually, about 4,767 job opportunities, production of methanol,

40,000 tonnes of animal feeds and generation of 11 mgwt of electricity.

The Executive Director also said another development partner from the United Arab Emirates (UAE) is ready to invest between 1 to 10 million U.S. dollars for the exportation of the Alfalfa plant and that 100,000 hectares would be required for the cultivation of the plant.

On the purchase of earth moving equipment, Mohammed suggested that the state government should get Ijarah Sukuk at the capital market for between 5 and 7 years pointing out that it would reduce cost and the equipment would return the investment made without the State necessarily putting in much money into it.

Additionally, there has been a reaction from The Nigeria Grand Progressive Network (NGPN) published by Opr. news of 15th November 2023, associating the Ambassador and his colleagues with MNVIN and its stated opinions.

'imperative to clarify unequivocally that the views expressed by MNVIN are solely theirs, and the Ambassador is not affiliated with the group, nor have any dealings of any sort.

'Contrary to any suggestions, he has not advocated for the dismissal of the Foreign Affairs Minister, Amb. Yusufu Tuggar. His focus remains steadfast on diplomatic affairs and the welfare of Nigerian ambassadors who entrusted to him the deanship. Ambassador Ominyi for those who know him can attest that he is a courageous politician who does not canvass his opinion under a faceless group.

Develop National Soil Information Systems, To Prevent Hunger In Nigeria, Prof Oluwatosin Tells FG

University Don and Professor of Soil Survey and Land Evaluation, Prof Gabriel Akinboye Oluwatosin has advocated development of a national soil information system in Nigeria.

Prof Oluwatosin made the call on Thursday, while delivering the 377 inaugural lecture of Obafemi Awolowo University, Ile-Ife titled, "Soil in Food and National Security: Matter Arising", held at the Obafemi Awolowo University, Ile Ife.

The Professor of Soil Survey and Land Evaluation, declared that in doing this, Federal government and other stakeholders should develop a national soil information systems in the country.

He pointed out that this is necessary in order to ensure production of nourishing food and prevent hunger in the country, adding that the world is presently facing a modern soil crisis and soil degradation.

"Food and national security are intrinsically linked to the soil. At tempting to accommodate growing food demand through unsustainable intensification and management practices is degrading the soil and we are running out of arable and grazing lands", he said

Prof Oluwatosin added, "To avoid further degradation, land should be used in accordance with its capability. We must care for soil and take measures to maintain its capability and working conditions in order to restore what has been lost through regenerative agriculture.

"Mr. Vice Chancellor sir, I

would like to make the f o l l o w i n g recommendations: Development of a national holistic soil information systems based on the genoform and capability systems for easy connectivity among scientists and land users. Nigeria needs semidetailed digital soil maps for ease of planning and policy making".

The University Don, stressed, "Development and reporting of a national soil capability system and a resolution that is effective across scales (farm, state and regional) to underpin account for soil. Adoption of elevation strategies and indicators of the continuum of soil condition in the form of a minimum data set as well as soil management at local, spatial and temporal scales".

Speaking further, Prof Oluwatosin recommended that, "a national soil information systems is needed in order to ensure easy connectivity among of scientists and land users", adding that food and national security are linked to the soil.

Emphasizing that Nigeria is running out of arable and grazing lands, he said that to avoid further degradation, land should be used in accordance with its capability, saying, "Reporting the value of the soil asset through developing a statement of Nigeria's natural capital. Developing a national account for soil in order to recognise the value that soil contributes to the financial and business sectors".

The lecture was attended by the Vice Chancellor of the institution, Professor Adebayo Banire and Executive Director of Institute of Agricultural Research and Training, Professor Veronica Obatolu. By; SULAIMAN AHMED MISAU, Katsina

Jerry Adams is a seasoned tax administrator, chartered accountant, business development expert and marketer with over 23 years professional experience.



Court Restrains Gov Adeleke, OSHA Others From Removing Osun CJ, Judicial Commission Secretary

he National Industrial Court, Ibadan Division on Thursday, restrained Governor Ademola Adeleke, the Osun State House of Assembly, the Attorney-General, the Accountant General and the Osun State Judicial Service Commission from removing, suspending the Chief Judge and Secretary to the Osun State Judicial Service Commission by Justice Bola Adepele Ojo and Mr Obidiya.

Justice J. D. Peters of the National Industrial Court gave the order while ruling on the separate suits filed by Chief Judge of Osun state and Mr Obidiya n u m b e r e d NICN/IB/60/2023 and NICN/IB/61/2023 respectively at Ibadan Division.

The judge in the ruling in the motion ex parte after hearing Oladipo Olasope SAN for applicant with O. G. lge restrained the defendants from and or otherwise tampering with the enjoyment of the Offices of the Chief Judge and Secretary to the Osun State Judicial Service Commission by Justice Bola Adepele Ojo and Mr Obidiya pending the hearing of the applications on notice of the plaintiffs.

The rulings were delivered on 15th and November 16, 2023, by Hon Justice J. D. Peters in in the separate suits filed by the said Chief Judge and Mr Obidiya and n u m b e r e d NICN/IB/60/2023 and NICN/IB/61/2023 respectively at Ibadan Division.

"An order of interim injunction is issued restraining the Defendants by themselves or their agents or privies howsoever so—called from interfering with removing, reversing or terminating the appointment and

conditions of service of the applicant as the Secretary of the Osun State Judicial Service including but not limited to salaries and other pecuniary benefits pending the determination of the interlocutory application.

"An order of interim injunction is here issued restraining the Defendants from appointing Mrs. Abosede Fagbola to the position of secretary of the J u d i c i a 1 S e r v i c e Commission and or giving effect to the circular issued by the Defendants dated 711) November 2023 transfering the said Mrs Abosede Fagbola to the Judicial Service.

"The 4th Defendant, Accountant General of Osun State, is here ordered and directed to continue to pay the salary, entitlements, emoluments, remuneration and other benefits and moneys the claimant is entitled to as the secretary of Osun State Judicial Service Commission pending the determination of the interlocutory application." Justice Peters stressed, " Let me add because I feel it is important for me to so add that it is safe for me to and I do take Judicial notice of the obvious fact that His Excellency Governor Ademola Adeleke of Osun State is a beneficiary of the Judiciary and the Rule of Law. Thus I-lis Excellency would ensure compliance with this order by all and sundry in his administration.

" I direct that this order together with the motion on notice and all other processes in this case be served on the Defendants immediately. Case is adjourned to 12/12/2023 to hear the pending motion on notice. Hearing notice is also to issue and. be served on the Defendants with;the proof of same in the file".

Troops Neutralize Six Bandits During Clearance Operations In Birnin Gwari, Giwa LGAs

Kaduna State 2024 Budget: How Far So Far?

t is disturbing that less than fifty days to the end of the year, the Kaduna State 2024 budget proposal has not been presented, by Governor (Senator) Uba Sani, before the Kaduna State House of Assembly. By this time last year, the executive budget town-hall meeting had been held, the budget proposal presented to the State Assembly and appropriation public hearing done with.

Worthy of note, the State over the past seven years had returned to the January to December fiscal year. The current delay threatens to take us to the days of uncertainty of our fiscal calendar with huge implication for development and investments.

Not to forget that presenting it to the citizens and State Assembly within a short timeframe to review can compromise the quality of scrutiny towards ensuring fiscal realism and allocations to strategic priorities.

As of this point there is no publicly available information that the State Assembly has approved through a resolution the Medium Term Expenditure Framework MTEF (2024-2026), in line with the Fiscal Responsibility Law, 2016.

The current administration campaigned with the SUSTAIN blueprint to sustain and consolidate on the work of its predecessor. The delay in holding the executive budget town-hall meeting, has raised anxiety as to whether the administration will upload its campaign promise on Nurturing Citizens' Engagement.

There is no gainsaying the State is faced with a myriad of challenges cutting across huge debt service burden, arrears of liabilities, rising poverty, unemployment, inflation, child and maternal mortality, out-of-school children, insecurity amongst others.

Thankfully, these were some of the issues the Governor campaigned on addressing during the gubernatorial elections. This is why all eyes are awaiting to see the content of the 2024 budget, which will be the first budget under the current administration.

Lets engage, ask the right questions and hold the government accountable.

Tinubu And Ganduje Shouldn't Play With Fire In Kano

n a predict able, premeditated, and carefully choreographed judicial charade, the Court of Appeal on Friday, upheld the verdict of the Kano State Governorship Election Petition Tribunal that reversed the electoral triumph of NNPP's Governor Abba Yusuf of Kano State. I sincerely hope this assault on justice isn't the spark that ignites an inferno in Kano—and in the country.

The signs had been evident since e a r l y O c t o b e r t h a t a predetermination had been made that irrespective of the facts, the flawed, preplanned judgment of the election petition tribunal must be preserved at all costs.

For example, on October 6, the Head of the Legal Department of INEC in Kano State by the name of Suleiman Alkali wrote a curious letter stating that INEC, which had declared NNP's Yusuf as the validly elected winner of the governorship election in Kano, was no longer interested in defending its declaration.

"I have been instructed by the commission headquarters that INEC as an umpire has no reason to appeal any judgment," he wrote. "Consequently, the National Commission in charge of Legal Services and National Commissioner in charge of Kano zone directed that the appeal be withdrawn and all processes for all appeals should be forwarded to the Kano Office."

In response to the jolt and outrage that the letter generated, Sam Olumekun, INEC's National Commissioner and chairman of its Information and Voter Education Committee, said Alkali wasn't authorized to write the letter, pointing out that the letter had "since been withdrawn and the officer reprimanded." We weren't told the nature of the "reprimand" because it was a lie.

That was exactly what played out when INEC acted in cahoots with Ahmed Lawan to steal APC's Bashir Machina's Yobe North Senatorial District primary win, which the Supreme Court affirmed in a shameless show of what I called judicial banditry.

(Retired Justice Musa Dattijo Muhammed quoted his colleague's quotation of my abrasive censure of the Supreme Court in his parting shots at his colleagues even though he and his colleague didn't give me

credit— and slightly misquoted me. I said in a February 6 article titled "Lawan and Supreme Court of Shameless Judicial Bandits" that "Nigeria's Supreme Court is, without a doubt, a rotten gaggle of useless, purchasable judicial bandits. The highest bidder gets their judgement." Dattijo used "voter" where I used "rotten.").

Anyway, on September 5, 2022, an INEC lawyer by the name of Onyechi Ikpeazu, SAN, had filed an affidavit at the Federal High Court to discredit the result of its own election that had declared Machina as the winner of the Yobe North APC senatorial primary election.

In the aftermath of the shock and fury that attended this, Festus Okoye, at the time INEC's National Commissioner and chairman of its Information and Voter Education Committee Festus, repudiated Ikpeazu's affidavit and said, "the Commission will review its quality assurance protocols, including the preview by appropriate ranking Officials of all processes filed on its behalf to ascertain their correctness in all material particulars with all reports and all information at its disposal before their presentation so that a situation like this is not repeated."

Well, that situation was repeated in Kano in October this year, almost exactly a year later. It seems to be a well-practiced pattern. INEC first flies a kite, sees how high it flies, then crashes it. But the whole point is to prepare the minds of the public for what is being hatched so as to minimize its shock value when it finally materializes.

If the outcome of the Ahmed Lawan and Bashir Machina case is any guide, it means INEC is deeply complicit in Ganduje's chicanery and plot to steal Yusuf's governorship. It might also mean that the "judicial bandits" I talked about at the Supreme Court are waiting in the wings to feast on another stolen electoral dinner. I hope I am wrong.

The second indication that this appeal court judgment was a well-rehearsed theater came when the appeal court completed its deliberations on November 6 but deferred its judgment until November 17 and then requested that security be heightened in Kano in anticipation of the publicizing of its judgement.

Only people in a dry run for the abortion of justice ask for a nticipatory protection from their potential victims.

As I pointed out in my September 23, 2023, column titled "Why the Kano Verdict Can't Stand," it is apparent that former Kano State governor and current APC national chairman Abdullahi Ganduje has resolved to damn a 1 1 consequences and use the federal might at his disposal to wrest the power that his party and his flunkey lost to Rabiu Kwankwaso and his son-in-law in the governorship election.

"APC appears intent to get back through judicial manipulation what it lost through the ballot box," I wrote. "It's a h i g h e r - o r d e r, m o r e sophisticated, and less primitive version of the broad-day electoral heist they perpetrated in 2019 after former Governor

lost to the same Abba Yusuf."

In a defiant disregard for potentially untoward consequences, Ganduje—of course, with President Bola Ahmed Tinubu's blessing—has decided to pull all strings to snatch judicial victory from the jaws of electoral defeat.

As I will show shortly, both the election tribunal and the appeal court are not even pretending to be fair in their judgments. They have already been handed a verdict and mandated to fish for evidence to justify it. The verdict, of course, is that NNPP's Abba Yusuf must go and must be replaced by APC's Nasiru Gawuna.

In rhetorical studies, we call that finalism, that is, a conclusion in search of evidence. Psychologists call it "motivated reasoning," that is, tendentious interpretation intentionally designed to produce a predetermined outcome. Philosophers call that armchair hermeneutics, that is, reasoning that ignores the evidence.



The Daily Trust reported Justice Moore A. Adumein as predicating the nullification of Yusuf's victory on the fact of his not being a member of the NNPP when he was nominated by the party. "As rightfully found, Yusuf Abba was not a member of the NNPP at the time he was purportedly sponsored by his party and he was not qualified to contest the March Governorship Election," Justice Adumein reportedly said.

Yet, in quashing the election of APC's House of Representatives member Musa Iliyasu Kwankwaso and reinstating NNPP's Yusuf Umar Datti as the validly elected member to represent Kano's Kura/Madobi/Garun Malam Federal Constituency seat, the same appeal court said two weeks ago that "the issue of membership of a political party is an internal affair, which no court has jurisdiction on," according to the LEADERSHIP newspaper.

I had thought that this was settled law. As I wrote in a previous column, "A May 26 Supreme Court ruling also says rival parties have no right to question the validity of the internal decisions made by other parties unless they can prove that they suffered demonstrable harm as a result of the internal decisions

another party took. So, the Kano governorship election tribunal's verdict on this issue will be as dead as a dodo upon appeal."

The question now is, why is NNPP's Yusuf being held to a different standard? I get that Kwankwaso and Yusuf didn't handle their victory well. Instead of being happy, their victory roused destructive vengeance and mean-spiritedness in them. But that's no reason to steal their legitimately earned victory.

I am certain that NNPP will take this case to the Supreme Court. If the Supreme Court is guided by its precedents, which is never guaranteed, I have no doubt that it will invalidate the judgements of the lower courts.

But this is clearly not a legal issue. It's a battle for political supremacy in Kano between Ganduje and Kwankwaso in which Ganduje is deploying the courts as cudgels to fustigate Kwankwaso.

My advice for President Tinubu is to be very watchful because this is really treacherous territory. Righteous anger over obvious injustice—on top of ongoing existential torment in the country—can spark violence whose consequence we can't predict.

An Indolent Labour Union And Matters Arising

here is no Nigerian that will tell you he is not aware of the NLC even if he does not know that it is an acronym for the Nigeria Labour Congress. What the average Nigerian knows about them is that they always go on strike at the drop of a hat, strikes that have lost their meaning because they always achieve almost nothing.

Well, there's nothing in it for the average Nigerian; only for the vanguards of the congress. At least, that is what an average citizen will tell you. This suspicion, or rather an assumption, is fueled by the fact that days into a strike, the comrades would be shown on national television laughing and exchanging banters with government officials, and the next you hear is that the strike is suspended while the reasons for the strike in the first place remain unresolved.

Citizens suspect the laughs from the chubby-cheeked people on the telly mean each side is happy with what transpired at the closed-door meeting despite the cause of the strike remaining unsolved.

A good example is that of fuel increase or subsidy withdrawal. The labour leaders would shout, give ultimatums and then mobilise workers for a strike. And these strikes affect everyone, not only workers because the public and private sectors are intricately connected. Yet the issue (subsidy) lingers: the palliatives promised, even though mainly targeted to help government workers, are too little or are still being awaited.

We were witnesses to a long strike, getting to almost a year, by the Academic Staff Union of Universities (ASUU), yet the NLC was nowhere to be found.

But what is getting alarming now is that the labour union, like our governments and their institutions, is becoming a tool for personal causes. There is no reason for the union to call a national strike because its president was assaulted. If he was attacked because he was fighting for fairness and justice, then that should be seen as a sacrifice for his role.

Mahatma Gandhi, Nelson Mandela, Aminu Kano, Gambo Sawaba and many other great freedom and human rights fighters never privatised or personalised their struggles or made people fight the system because they were assaulted.

In any case, how many Nigerians have been attacked, humiliated and dehumanised without the labour union fighting for them? How many have been killed, some by non-state actors and some by security agents? And some victims were public servants. If labour says it is there for the workers, where was it?

And despite this, they are full of cowardice. For instance, the labour union president was manhandled in Owerri, but they came to Abuja Airport to block access roads and, after that, they embarked on a nationwide strike.

We have had many labour leaders, right from Michael Imoudu, popularly known as Pa Imoudu, the father of labour

unionism in Nigeria, but none of them personalised the labour struggle till now.

Wahab Goodluck, the first president of the NLC, who served between 1978 and 1984, led the struggle for better wages and working conditions. He fought against the government's attempt to deregulate the economy and privatise state-owned enterprises. He organised the NLC and made it a force to be reckoned with, but he never personalised the struggle.

Paschal Bafyau, who took over from Goodluck, made the NLC more politically conscious and active, but he never personalised the union. He successfully negotiated a minimum wage and led the union in the fight to usher in civilian rule in 1999.

One of the greatest presidents the NLC ever had was Ali Ciroma, who served from 1988 to 1994. He fought against General Ibrahim Badamasi Babangida's move to introduce the Structural Adjustment Programme (SAP). The union gained strength and influence under his leadership, but one thing he did not do was personalise its activities.


Adams Oshiomhole, who served as its president from 1999 to 2007, gave the labour union more visibility, influence and effectiveness but he never personalised its fight.

One may contend that the quality of the labour union and its search for solutions for the Nigerian worker and, ultimately, the country started nose-diving after Oshiomhole. Many people expected the union to be at the vanguard of solving the country's problems instead of being selfserving and bringing archaic ways to help the workers and the country.

A good example is the one to do with minimum wage. For how long will labour unions continue mouthing 'salary increments' in the face of dwindling national income and the plummeting value of our currency?

Perhaps out of intellectual paucity, they have failed to propose a more intellectually viable option, to both workers and the government, about how to stabilise the naira and make us a nation that produces what it consumes and vice

Every patriot knows that buying things patriotic labour union should be the last to

sanction a situation where our government spends hundreds of billions of naira annually to buy cars from foreign manufacturers, thereby keeping afloat other countries' economies to the detriment of ours.

But Nigerian labour leaders feel comfortable being chauffeur-driven in foreign cars, keeping foreign businesses thriving and foreigners employed while Nigerian youths are jobless and languishing in abject poverty because the from abroad causes capital flight. A country's industries are dead. How patriotic! This is why they cannot offer a

better alternative other than asking for a salary increment. They do not have the intellectual capacity to know that it is not the quantity but the quality of the currency that matters.

Take, for instance, the case of China and Germany, where the minimum wages are \$358 (about \(\frac{1}{2}\)405,000 as of last week) and 1557 euro (\aleph 1,845,000) respectively, now cast your mind back to when the naira was at par with the dollar and assume our minimum wage of №30,000 is \$30,000, don't you think that is more than enough? Yet still, workers in some of these countries enjoy free housing, healthcare, education, affordable public transport and a constant supply of electricity. This is why salaries have value there.

Our labour union, which should be fighting for better working conditions and stronger currency, is instead fighting for more money, thereby courting inflation and encouraging capital flight through patronising foreign goods and services.

With our bumbling, self-serving and intellectually lazy labour union, it is high time we started scrutinising their motives and their base desires.

Skills Not Degrees, Solution Of Burning Certificates

ust recently, a graduate of Ajayi Crowther University burnt all his certificates for not being able to secure a job after his university programme.

Olutimain Ilenre was not the first person that burnt his degree certificate for lack of job in Nigeria, there were numerous graduates that had done similar for similar reason, nationally and internationally.

In 2020, Usman Abubakar from Katsina State burnt his degree certificate including his National Youth Service Corp (NYSC) certificate for suffering years without a government job.

While there are many Nigerian graduates who are depressed, worried and agonized because they couldn't get jobs with their schools' certificates. Bridget Thapwile Soko a Rwandan, burnt a degree certificate in Business Administration for not being able to secure a job, for the crime, the university revoked the certificate.

Also, a graduate of Mount Kenya University burnt his primary, secondary school and university certificates in June 2023 for similar reason of unemployment.

A 33-year-old lady identified as Dr Helana Darwin expressed worries in a tweet, stating that, "How am I 33 with two MAs and a PhD and still so precariously situated on the job market? I feel like I went about my 20s all wrong. Maybe-just maybe-higher education is overrated?" she wrote.

Lack of job can cause psychological trauma that can lead to loss of life and until something is done the pressure on unemployed Nigerians will continue to reflect in many ways.

Unemployment has been a reason for many atrocities in Nigeria, it caused many to indulge in drug peddling, drug abuse, terrorism, armrobbery, prostitution and many more criminal activities graduates cannot fend for themselves after study.

Degree is just a certificate but skill matters even without the certificate. The negative impact on so many Nigerian graduates is they pursue the certificate not the skill, and this is the set back among Nigerian graduates.

The book, "Skills Not Degrees: The New White Collar Job by Professor Idris Muhammad Bugaje provided the answer on why Nigeria should have more polytechnics than universities. Polytechnics are skills oriented institutions, they equip students with skills' talent and empower them to be self-reliance even after school, this is why there is no existing story of a polytechnic graduate that burn a diploma certificate. But, thanks to NYSC for introducing a Skills Acquisition & Entreprenuership Department (SAED) to expose corps members to skills jobs that can help them start business after school.

But, Skills Acquisition & Entreprenuership Department (SAED)cannot be the core solution to unemployment stress and trauma in Nigeria, the solution is "Skills Not Degrees" because what the graduates can learn in less than two weeks pf skill training? How can they get capital to start the business? With this rhetoric questions; SAED can not mitigate unemployment trauma among Nigerian youths who think with their degree certificates they must get jobs as superior officers. Polytechnic students are taught to be servant of work, they are engineers that do the practical work; the work as bricklayer not supervisor or construction managers but the real maker of the work.

With 159 number of

polytechnics in Nigeria and 264 universities in the country the equation of unemployment must go higher than employment. Skills can prepare Nigerian polytechnic graduates to secure jobs beyond the country. They will travel to outside nations with pride and fat salary as skills workers. The criteria of employment in the developed nations is "show them what you can do practically" not what the

expensive grades on degree certificate.

As the government cannot provide job for every graduate, Nigeria need more polytechnics than universities to improve practical science and technology, and this will lead the country to a giant of Africa's position. It will also reduce the high number of jobless youths in the country, cut the size of human trafficking and fast track Nigeria's growth. It will boost

the economy, invite investors and make the country efficient but until more polytechnics are established like China that converted 600 universities to polytechnics.

Nigeria would have been ahead in the 25th minute, but defender Shukurat Oladipo's well-struck free-kick from 40 yards was parried away by goalkeeper Zulfa Ally Makau. Ajakaye failed to make hay with another opportunity in the 33rd minute.

On the hour mark, defender Comfort Folorunsho broke the spell of 1-1draws for Nigeria's national teams in recent weeks, when she leapt highest to head home from Afolabi's cross after a couple of touches from a corner kick.

The Falconets will now take on Burundi in the final round of qualifiers, to determine one of Africa's flagbearers at next year's global championship to be hosted by Colombia.


overturn the judgement and the declaration of Governor Dauda Lawal.
